# Application for electricity distribution rates and other charges beginning May 1, 2023

# PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 1 October 18, 2022

PUC Distribution Inc. (PUC Distribution) filed a cost of service application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on August 31, 2022 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that PUC Distribution charges for electricity distribution, beginning May 1, 2023.

A Notice of Hearing was issued on September 23, 2022. Each of Consumers Council of Canada (CCC), Environmental Defence, School Energy Coalition (SEC), and Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC) applied for intervenor status and cost eligibility.

No objection was received from PUC Distribution.

CCC, Environmental Defence, SEC, and VECC are approved as intervenors. The list of parties in this proceeding is attached as Schedule A to this Procedural Order. CCC, Environmental Defence, SEC, and VECC are eligible to apply for an award of costs under the OEB's Practice Direction on Cost Awards.

Cost eligible intervenors should be aware that the OEB will not generally allow the recovery of costs for the attendance of more than one representative of any party unless a compelling reason is provided when cost claims are filed.

Being eligible to apply for recovery of costs is not a guarantee of recovery of any costs claimed. Cost awards are made by way of OEB order at the end of a hearing.

#### **Issues List**

At this time, the OEB is making provision for the development of an issues list prior to the filing of interrogatories. PUC Distribution, OEB staff and the intervenors shall develop and OEB staff shall file a proposed issues list for the OEB's consideration. The OEB will approve an issues list prior to the filing of interrogatories.

#### Interrogatories

At this time, provision is being made for written interrogatories. The OEB will review the single test year application both in the context of the projects and programs that are requested for the test year and from the perspective of the distributor's plans for the subsequent four years until the next scheduled rebasing application.

Parties should examine the value presented by the proposed investments as opposed to focusing only on the costs. Parties should also assess the fit between the applicant's plans and its stated objectives and consider how the plans contribute to positive outcomes for customers, in particular those outcomes that arise from the asset management decisions reflected in the applicant's distribution system plan. The OEB will consider the entire five-year distribution system plan to assess the planning and pacing proposals of the applicant and whether the test year requests are appropriately aligned with the distribution system plan. The OEB will also consider productivity and benchmarking results in assessing cost forecasts, bill impacts and distributor performance.

Parties should not engage in detailed exploration of items that do not appear to be material. Parties should use the materiality thresholds documented in Chapter 2 of the Filing Requirements as a guide. In making its decision on cost awards, the OEB will consider whether intervenors made reasonable efforts to ensure that their participation in the hearing was focused on material issues.

Parties should consult sections 26 and 27 of the OEB's <u>Rules of Practice and Procedure</u> regarding required naming and numbering conventions and other matters related to interrogatories.

#### **Presentation of Settlement Proposal**

The OEB is making provision for a settlement conference. Following the settlement conference, provision is being made for the filing of letters informing the OEB of the status of the settlement discussions.

Further procedural orders may be issued by the OEB.

#### THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. OEB staff shall file a proposed issues list, or, alternatively, shall advise the OEB in writing that the parties and OEB staff have been unable to reach an agreement on a draft issues list by **October 24, 2022**.
- 2. OEB staff and intervenors shall request any relevant information and documentation from PUC Distribution that is in addition to the evidence already filed, by written interrogatories filed with the OEB and served on all parties by **November 8, 2022**.
- 3. PUC Distribution shall file with the OEB complete written responses to all interrogatories and serve them on OEB staff and all intervenors by **November 28, 2022**.
- 4. A settlement conference among the parties and OEB staff will be convened on **December 12, 2022**, starting at 9:30 a.m. If necessary, the settlement conference will continue on **December 13 and 14, 2022**. Information on how to participate will be provided in advance of the conference.
- 5. **Within 48 hours** of the conclusion of the settlement conference, PUC Distribution shall file a letter informing the OEB of the status of the settlement discussions including whether a tentative agreement had been reached or if the parties propose to continue the settlement discussions.
- If there is no settlement proposal arising from the settlement conference, PUC Distribution shall file a statement to that effect with the OEB by **December 20**,
   2022. In that event, parties shall file and serve on the other parties by **January 9**, 2023 any submissions on which issues shall be heard in writing, and for which issues the OEB should hold an oral hearing.
- 7. If there is a settlement, any settlement proposal arising from the settlement conference shall be filed with the OEB on or before **January 23, 2023**. In addition to outlining the terms of any settlement, the settlement proposal should contain a list of any unsettled issues, indicating with reasons whether the parties believe those issues should be dealt with by way of oral or written hearing.
- 8. Any submission from OEB staff on a settlement proposal shall be filed with the OEB and served on all parties by **February 2, 2023**.

Parties are responsible for ensuring that any documents they file with the OEB, such as applicant and intervenor evidence, interrogatories and responses to interrogatories or any other type of document, **do not include personal information** (as that phrase is

defined in the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*), unless filed in accordance with rule 9A of the OEB's Rules of Practice and Procedure.
