EB-2022-0041 – Hydro One Remote Communities Inc. – 2023 Revenue Requirement and Rates Application – WPLP’s Request for intervenor status

Hydro One Remotes Communities Inc. (“Remotes” or “HORCI”) is in receipt of Wataynikaneyap Power LP’s (“WPLP”) intervention request, dated October 17th, 2022, in the above noted proceeding. Remotes does not object to WPLP’s participation but expects the scope of WPLP’s intervention to pertain only to the issues that specifically affect them.

In its letter, WPLP states that its interest for intervening in this Application is to address the following:

- (a) the planned integration of HORCI's distribution system into the WPLP's Transmission System over the 2022 to 2024 period;
- (b) the capital and operating costs arising from this planned integration, along with other impacts of its integration with the Transmission System on HORCI's revenue requirement; for which WPLP claims form a substantive part of HORCI's cost of service application; and
- (c) the impact of HORCI's requests to raise its electricity rates and recover the above-noted costs on the First Nation communities that will be served by HORCI once connected to the provincial grid through the Transmission System.

In respect of items (b) and (c) of WPLP’s intervention request, Remotes submits as follows:

- (b) The capital and operating costs arising from the integration, and any related issues from the planned integration, should be limited to costs, work or investments impacting WPLP specifically.
- (c) As WPLP is an electricity transmitter to Remotes, it is not impacted by HORCI’s electricity rates. Rather, recovery of costs affects Remotes’ customers only.

Should the OEB approve WPLP as an intervenor in this Application, Remotes would like WPLP's scope of intervention to pertain only to the issues that specifically affect WPLP.

A copy has been filed on the OEB's electronic filing system and served on all parties.
