Burlington Hydro Inc. has applied to raise its electricity distribution rates effective May 1, 2023.

Burlington Hydro Inc. has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to raise its electricity distribution rates effective May 1, 2023. If the application is approved as filed, a typical residential customer and a typical general service customer of Burlington Hydro Inc. would see the following increase:

Rate Class	Monthly Bill Impact
Residential 750 kWh	\$1.06 per month
General Service less than 50 kW (2,000 kWh)	\$0.80 per month

The requested rate increase is set using an OEB-approved formula which is tied to inflation and other factors intended to promote efficiency.

The rate increase also includes Burlington Hydro Inc.'s request to recover the costs (and carrying charges) related to the damage caused to its distribution system by a windstorm. Burlington Hydro Inc. is proposing to recover these costs from customers over a 12 month period and the above-noted bill impacts reflect the impact of this proposal.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider Burlington Hydro's application. We will determine whether the company has used the applicable models and formulas required by the OEB and whether to approve Burlington Hydro's request to recover windstorm related costs and carrying charges. We will also hear questions and arguments from individuals that have registered to participate (called intervenors) in the OEB's hearing. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide what, if any, rate increase will be allowed.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review Burlington Hydro's application on the OEB's website now
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing
- You can become an intervenor. As an intervenor, you can ask questions about Burlington Hydro's application and make arguments on whether the OEB should approve Burlington Hydro's request. Apply by **November 11**, **2022** or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website

The OEB intends to consider cost awards in this proceeding that are in accordance with the *Practice Direction on Cost Awards* and only in relation to Burlington Hydro's request to recover storm related costs.

However, your personal telephone number, home address and email address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This rate hearing will be held under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c.15, Schedule B.
