The information listed on the OEB posting for the Enbridge Rate Change Application is insufficient to determine "actual" impact to customers such as myself. In particular, the adjustment to rates going forward, beyond the first few years, is wide open and too open ended to be allowed as is.

The selection by the applicant to choose a hearing in person precludes individuals from attending and having any impact or say in the proceedings.
