Why are distribution fees increasing and I paying more, annually, for a service that remains unchanged to me as a customer from a provider who holds a veritable monopoly? I don't get to choose because there are no competitors. My usage is approximately the same and yet my bill is now 30% more due to global markets and I'm now informed that Enbridge wishes to tack on an additional \$28 per annum increased fee for distribution for no change in service. To what end? For the benefit of whom? Why does no one but the monopoly get a say in this?

I appreciate that Enbridge and its shareholders may not be concerned about an extra \$28/year due to their probable financial comfort, but not only are they unlikely to feel \$28 a year, but they're not the only provider asking for arbitrary rate increases blaming it on unprecedented times.
