PUC Distribution Inc.

Application for electricity distribution rates and other charges beginning May 1, 2023

PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 4 March 1, 2023

PUC Distribution Inc. (PUC Distribution) filed a cost of service application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that PUC Distribution charges for electricity distribution, beginning May 1, 2023. The application was accepted by the OEB as complete as of September 14, 2022.

Procedural Order No. 1 was issued on October 18, 2022, which among other matters, set out dates for procedural steps for this case. Procedural Order No. 1 noted that if there is a settlement, any settlement proposal arising from the settlement conference shall be filed with the OEB on or before January 23, 2023. In addition to outlining the terms of any settlement, the settlement proposal should contain a list of any unsettled issues, indicating with reasons whether the parties believe those issues should be dealt with by way of oral or written hearing.

On December 21, 2022, PUC Distribution filed a letter to advise the OEB that a tentative agreement had been reached on all issues in the proceeding, and that the parties had agreed to work together to draft a settlement proposal.

On January 23, 2023, the OEB received a request from PUC Distribution for an extension to the date for filing a settlement proposal from January 23, 2023 to February 13, 2023. The OEB granted the extension and issued Procedural Order No. 2 on January 25, 2023.

On February 13, 2023, the OEB received a request from PUC Distribution for an extension to the date for filing a settlement proposal from February 13, 2023, to February 27, 2023. The letter indicated there were unique aspects of the settlement proposal that were taking additional time to resolve. The OEB granted the extension and issued Procedural Order No. 3 on February 16, 2023.

On February 27, 2023, the OEB received a request from PUC Distribution for an extension to the date for filing a settlement proposal from February 27, 2023, to March 6, 2023. The February 27 letter provided the same reasoning for the extension request as the February 13 letter.

The OEB grants the extension. The OEB finds it necessary to defer the dates for other steps in this proceeding due to the requested extension.

As noted in Procedural Orders No. 2 and No. 3, the OEB's <u>Protocol for Adjusting</u> <u>Adjudicative Timelines</u>¹ accounts for delays that are two weeks or longer and are driven by applicant requests. If the request is approved, the application will be paused for the duration of the delay. In a proceeding where the protocol is triggered, the performance standard will be extended by the total number of calendar days associated with the request, including the planned decision issuance date.²

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Any settlement proposal arising from the settlement conference shall be filed with the OEB on or before **March 6, 2023**. In addition to outlining the terms of any settlement, the settlement proposal should contain a list of any unsettled issues, indicating with reasons whether the parties believe those issues should be dealt with by way of oral or written hearing.
- 2. Any submission from OEB staff on a settlement proposal shall be filed with the OEB and served on all parties by **March 14, 2023**.

Parties are responsible for ensuring that any documents they file with the OEB, such as applicant and intervenor evidence, interrogatories and responses to interrogatories or any other type of document, **do not include personal information** (as that phrase is defined in the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*), unless filed in accordance with rule 9A of the OEB's <u>Rules of Practice and Procedure</u>.
