Re: Invitation to Regulatory Framework Workshop (EB-2022-0302)

The OEB is inviting members of the Framework for Energy Innovation Working Group (FEIWG), as well as the Chiefs of Ontario, Federation of Rental-Housing Providers of Ontario, Green Energy Coalition, and Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation, to participate in a virtual Regulatory Framework Workshop on **April 19, 2023** (April Workshop).

Background

On October 21, 2022, the Minister of Energy issued a <u>Letter of Direction</u>, in which the Minister asked the OEB to launch workshops to explore how it can help enable electrification related investments while protecting consumers' interests. The Minister also asked the OEB to provide the government's Electrification and Energy Transition Panel with its best advice on potential changes to the OEB's mandate and operations, including:

- Opportunities to incorporate environmental and economic development into the OEB's regulation of the sector
- Approaches to integrating regulation of the electricity and natural gas systems
- Enhancements to how the OEB and Market Surveillance Panel oversee the acquisition of energy resources, regulate the IESO and review long-term planning efforts

Invitation to Participate

We are seeking a diverse range of perspectives on changes to the OEB's mandate, tools or authorities that may be needed for the OEB to continue to regulate effectively in a time of significant sector transformation.

The FEIWG and the following organizations are invited to attend the April Workshop:

- Green Energy Coalition (GEC)
- Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation

These stakeholders and Indigenous communities have frequently engaged in OEB proceedings and initiatives over the last several years and will provide a diversity of viewpoints.

Invitees will also be invited to submit written comments after the April Workshop to provide additional feedback. Comments can be submitted to <u>rfworkshops@oeb.ca</u> and must be received by **May 9, 2023.**

The April Workshop is scheduled for April 19, 2023, from 9:30 AM to 12:00 PM.

To facilitate remote participation, the April Workshop will occur virtually. A separate Microsoft Teams invite will follow. An agenda and meeting materials will also be provided to registered participants in advance.
