Re: Electric Vehicle Integration (EVI) Initiative (EB-2023-0071) Electric Delivery Rates for Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Report and Invitation to Stakeholder Meeting

Today, the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) released its consultant report on <u>Electricity</u> <u>Delivery Rates for EV Charging</u> (the Report). The OEB is now inviting stakeholders to a meeting on May 24, 2023, to discuss details of the Report.

Background on the Report

As part of its work under the EVI Initiative, the OEB commissioned a consultant, Power Advisory, to complete an analysis of the impact delivery costs have on EV charging service providers and owners of EV fleets, and explore alternative delivery rate designs to determine how they may support EV adoption while adhering to sound ratemaking principles. The analysis includes commentary on the anticipated impact of those delivery rate designs on EV and non-EV consumers. This work is based, in part, on stakeholder feedback in related forums that delivery costs, and in particular demand charges, may serve as an impediment for public charging service providers and EV fleet owners, particularly in cases where charger utilization is low.

Invitation to Participate in Stakeholder Meeting

The OEB is inviting interested stakeholders to a virtual meeting on **May 24, 2023**, from **1 p.m. to 4 p.m.** The purpose of this meeting is to:

- Present the Report's findings on the impact of existing electricity delivery rates on EV adoption and the alternative rate designs explored by the consultant.
- Gather feedback from stakeholders on the Report's findings.

The OEB recognizes that this topic is of interest to many parties, and therefore welcomes feedback from a broad cross-section of industry stakeholders, whether or not they are directly involved with EVs. Stakeholders will also be invited to provide written feedback after the stakeholder meeting.

Participation

Cost Award Matters

Cost awards will be available to eligible participants under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* for participation in the consultation. Costs awarded will be recovered from all licensed rate-regulated electricity distributors. Further information regarding cost awards is included in **Appendix A** to this letter.

Appendix A Cost Award Matters

Cost Award Eligibility

The OEB will determine eligibility for costs in accordance with its <u>Practice Direction on</u> <u>Cost Awards</u>. Any person intending to request an award of costs must file with the OEB a written submission to that effect by **April 27**, **2023**. The submission must identify the grounds on which the person believes that it is eligible for an award of costs (addressing the OEB's cost eligibility criteria as set out in section 3 of the *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*). An explanation of any other funding to which the person has access must also be provided, as should the name and credentials of any lawyer, analyst or consultant that the person intends to retain, if known. All requests for cost eligibility will be posted on the OEB's website. If a licensed rate-regulated electricity distributor has any objections to any of the requests for cost eligibility, such objections must be filed with the OEB by **May 4**, **2023**. Any objections will be posted on the OEB's website. The OEB will then make a final determination on the cost eligibility of the requesting participants.
