AFFIDAVIT OF GEORGE DIMITROPOULOS

I, **George Dimitropoulos**, of the City of Toronto in the Province of Ontario, MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS:

1. I am employed as Senior Advisor, Regulatory Affairs, with the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) and as such have knowledge of the matters hereinafter deposed to.
2. On April 14, 2023 the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) issued its Notice (Notice) (attached hereto as **Exhibits A and B** in English and French respectively) for OEB proceeding EB-2022-0318, and by Letter of Direction (attached hereto as **Exhibit C**) directed the IESO to undertake a number of steps.
3. Per item 1 of the Letter of Direction, on April 18, 2023 the IESO posted a copy of the English and French versions of the Notice, the application and the evidence, and any amendments thereto, on the IESO's website at: <https://www.ieso.ca/en/Corporate-IESO/Regulatory-Accountability/OEB-Applications>. The Independent Electricity System Operator has applied for approval of its 2023, 2024 and 2025 revenue requirements, expenditures and usage fees

Learn more. Have your say.

The Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for approval of its proposed revenue requirements, expenditures and usage fees for fiscal years 2023, 2024 and 2025. If the applications are approved as filed, domestic and export customers of the IESO will see an increase in usage fees in each fiscal year.

The IESO is asking the Ontario Energy Board to approve the following:

- A 2023 revenue requirement of \$208.4 million and related usage fees of \$1.3857/MWh for domestic customers and \$1.0885/MWh for export customers effective January 1, 2023.
- A 2024 revenue requirement of \$218.4 million and related usage fees of \$1.4212/MWh for domestic customers and \$1.2455/MWh for export customers effective January 1, 2024.
- A 2025 revenue requirement of \$229.7 million and related usage fees of \$1.4499/MWh for domestic customers and \$1.4276/MWh for export customers effective January 1, 2025.
- Capital expenditures budgets for 2023, 2024 and 2025 of \$86.0 million, \$75.9 million, and \$58.2 million, respectively.
- A \$15 million operating reserve in the Forecast Variance Deferral Account.
- To charge (or rebate) market participants the difference between the 2023 OEB-approved usage fees and the interim usage fees paid by market participants, if any.

The IESO says that the proposed revenue requirements, expenditures and fees are based on its 2023-2025 Business Plan that was approved by the Minister of Energy on February 15, 2023.

Please review the applications for the complete list of approvals requested by the IESO.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider the IESO's application. During this hearing, which could be an oral or written hearing, we will consider the evidence filed by the IESO and question the company on its proposals. We will also hear questions and arguments from individuals that have registered to participate (called intervenors) in the OEB's hearing. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will make its decision on the IESO's application.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review the IESO's application on the OEB's website now
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing
- You can become an intervenor. As an intervenor, you can ask questions about the IESO's application and make arguments on whether the OEB should approve the IESO's request. Apply by **April 28, 2023**, or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website

If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.


