Re: Electric Vehicle Integration (EVI) Initiative (EB-2023-0071) Electric Delivery Rates for Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Report: Feedback Extension

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is extending the deadline to June 14, 2023 for feedback on its consultant report on <u>Electricity Delivery Rates for EV Charging</u> (the Report) released on April 13, 2023. The Report presented an analysis of the impact delivery costs have on EV charging service providers and owners of EV fleets, and explored alternative delivery rate designs to determine how they may support EV adoption while adhering to sound ratemaking principles. Along with the Report, the OEB released an accompanying <u>letter</u> which invited stakeholders/interested parties to attend a stakeholder engagement meeting on May 24, 2023 and to provide written comments by June 7, 2023.

The OEB would like to thank those who participated in the May 24, 2023 meeting and remind all stakeholders/interested parties that the materials from the meeting are posted on the Engage with Us Electric Vehicle Integration <u>website</u>.

On May 25, 2023, the Electricity Distributors Association (EDA) filed a written request for an extension to the deadline for written comments to June 14, 2023 to best facilitate feedback from EDA members.

The OEB has decided to grant the requested extension to June 14, 2023 for all parties and encourages the filing of written comments as soon as possible to help inform next steps. Instructions on making a written submission were provided in the original invitation letter and are repeated in Appendix A of this letter, below.
