

One of the greatest highs for Martin is the smile that grows over the face of a child who hears her

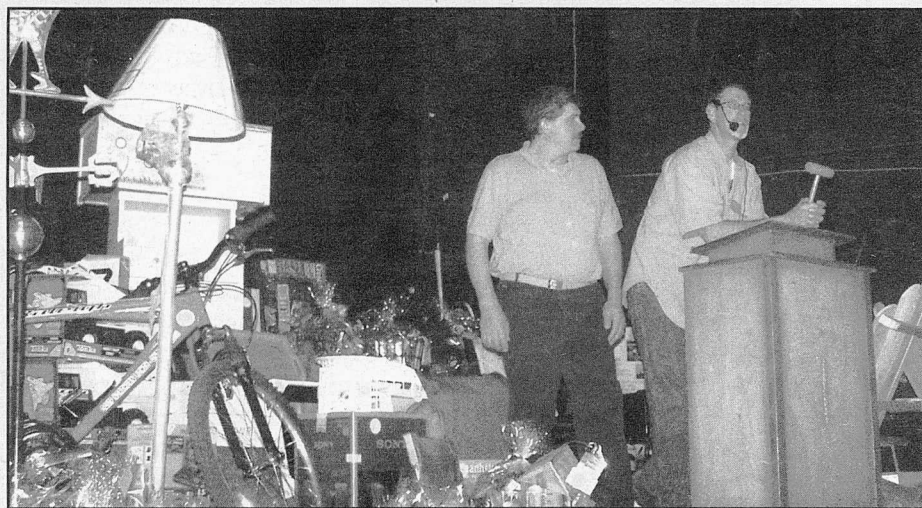
name for the first time in their life. This is one of the experiences that drives Martin.

WALKING CHARTER SIGNED

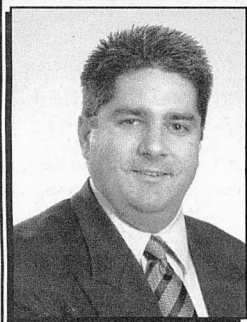

Einstein's re-invents itself as home decor store

Unless you're a collector, gallery owner or museum curator art, in all of its forms, is tied very closely to home decor.

Now, Pelham's shop for everything to do with wall art, is also the place to shop for furniture and home decor items.

Jean Bancroft, owner of Einstein's, explained the store's transformation from simply an art store to a home decor store,

with a full range of furniture and home decor items, evolved from her home consultations with customers.

Clients, said Bancroft, would ask her to visit their home and offer advice on the type of art they should purchase for their home. Those questions, she said, eventually started to include 'what colour should we paint the walls?' and 'do you know where we can get some funky lamps?'

By framing all of the store's wall art in house, Bancroft can proudly say the items in the store are Canadian made.

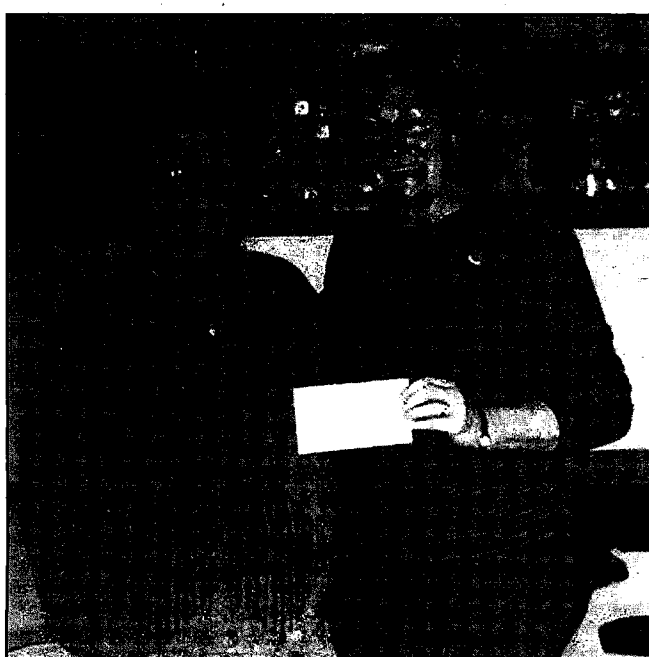
Although Bancroft is quick to point she is not an interior designer, she has worked in the busi-

Niagara Peninsula Energy Inc. – Peninsula West

The Ontario Energy Board has received an application on November 5, 2008 under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15 (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Niagara Peninsula Energy Inc. – Peninsula West ("Niagara Peninsula Energy – Peninsula West") charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2009. The Board has assigned the application file number EB-2008-0200. The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all of Niagara Peninsula Energy – Peninsula West's customers. The application was filed under the Board's guidelines for 2nd Generation Incentive Regulation, which provides for a mechanistic and formulaic adjustment to rates between cost of service applications.

Any change to the rates that Niagara Peninsula Energy – Peninsula West charges for electricity distribution will be reflected in the delivery charges. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers' electricity bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed.

Niagara Peninsula Energy – Peninsula West indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month would experience an approximate change in the electricity bill ranging from an increase of 1.7% to an increase of 1.8%, depending on their residential rate classification. This is an approximate \$0.68 increase per month on their bill. A small general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of 50 kW or lower would experience an approximate 0.9% increase in their delivery charges. 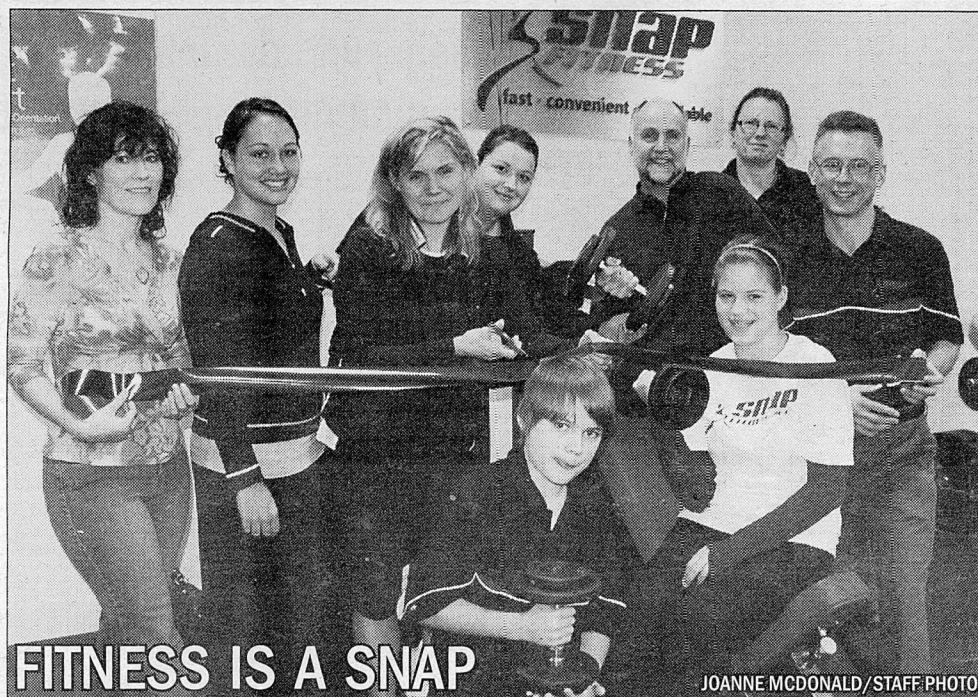

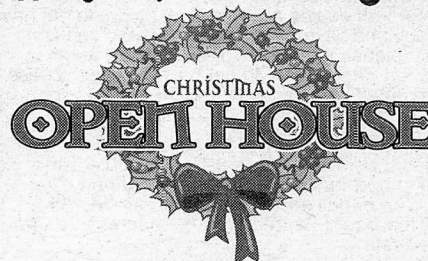
