NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND WRITTEN HEARING FOR AN ELECTRICITY DISTRIBUTION RATE CHANGE

Peterborough Distribution Incorporated Asphodel-Norwood

The Ontario Energy Board has received an application on November 05, 2007 under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998; c. 15 (Schedule B); seeking approval for changes to the rates that Peterborough Distribution incorporated Asphodel-Norwood charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2008. The Board has assigned the application file number EB-2007-0911. The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all of Peterborough Distribution Incorporated Asphodel-Norwood's customers.

Any change to the rates that Peterborough Distribution Incorporated Asphodel-Norwood charges for electricity distribution will be reflected in the delivery charges. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers' electricity bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed.

Peterborough Distribution Incorporated Asphodel-Norwood Indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month would experience an approximate 7.6% decrease in the electricity bill. A small general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of .50 kW or lower would see an approximate 6.6% decrease in the electricity bill.

How to see Peterborough Distribution Incorporated Asphodel-Norwood's Application

Copies of the application are available for inspection at the Board's office in Toronto and on its website, www.oeb.gov.on.ca, and at Peterborough Dietribution Incorporated Asphodel-Norwood's office.

How to Participate in the Rate Proceeding

The Board intends to proceed with Peterborough Distribution incorporated Asphodel-Norwood's rate change application by way of written hearing unless a party satisfies the Board that there is good reason for holding an oral hearing. If you object to a written hearing in this matter, you must provide written reasons why an oral hearing is necessary. Any objections to a written hearing must be received by the Board and copied to the applicant at the addresses below no later than December 7, 2007. The Board will not be awarding costs in this matter.

Anyone who wishes information and material from the applicant that is in addition to the evidence filled with the Board and that is relevant to the hearing, shall request it by written interrogatories filled with the Board and delivered to the applicant on or before December 21, 12007. The applicant shall fille with the Board complete responses to the interrogatories and deliver them to all parties who asked interrogatories no later than January 7, 2008.

Anyone who wishes to make a submission on the application must file that written submission with the Board and deliver it to the applicant by January 21, 2008. If the applicant wishes to respond to the submission(s), the written response must be filed with the Board and delivered to all parties who made submissions by February 4, 2008.

Asphodel-Norwood - Blood donors at the Norwood Town Hall were able to roll uptheir sleeves for Canada's troops as part of an ongoing campaign run by Canadian Blood Services.

The Canadian Armed Forces is the CBS's first "Partners for Life" member which allows relatives of members of the services to make a donation and sign a special gift card indicating their support.
