How should the Board know who is responsible to act without looking at the issues, the needs, and the options for response?

Parties are free to address the question of who does what at the consultation. However, the consultation should be allowed to canvass the views of all parties on all the issues at hand before any decisions are taken and any particular course of action is ruled out.
