## NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND HEARING

### PEARSON INTERNATIONAL FUEL FACILITIES CORPORATION APPLICATION FOR LEAVE TO CONSTRUCT A JET FUEL PIPELINE IN THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA

Pearson International Fuel Facilities Corporation (the "Applicant") has filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board, (the "Board") dated January 3, 2007, under section 90 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. 1998, c.15, Schedule B. The Applicant has applied for an order of the Board for leave to construct approximately 5.6 kilometres of 16 inch diameter jet fuel pipeline in the City of Mississauga.

The proposed pipeline will extend from a new bulk fuel storage facility on Torbram Road in a southeasterly direction along Torbram Road and Kimberly Street, through a portion of land owned by the Greater Toronto Airports Authority, across Derry Road into the Lester B. Pearson International Airport (the "Airport") to a connection point to the existing jet fuel storage and distribution system within the Airport (the "Existing System"). A map showing the location of the proposed pipeline is included in this Notice.

The Board has assigned File No. EB-2007-0009 to this application.

The Applicant advised that the proposed pipeline is needed to allow the transmission of additional volumes of jet fuel for the purposes of increasing the capacity of the Existing System to accommodate future growth at the Airport.

The Applicant proposes to start construction in July 2007 and place the pipeline in service by November 2007.

**How to Participate**

You may participate in this proceeding in one of three ways:

1. You may send the Board a letter of comment. Your letter should include any request to make an oral presentation to the Board, and must be received by the Board no later than 30 days from the publication date of this notice.
2. You may request observer status in order to receive documents issued by the Board in the proceeding. Your request must be made by letter received by the Board no later than 10 days from the publication date of this notice.
3. You may request intervenor status if you wish to actively participate in the proceeding. Your request must be made by letter of intervention received no later than 10 days from the publication date of this notice, or, if you have been served this notice personally, no later than 10 days from the date of service. Your letter of intervention must include a description of how you are, or may be, affected by the proceeding; and if you represent a group, a description of the group and its membership. The Board may choose to hold either a written or an oral hearing. Your letter of intervention should indicate your preference for a written or oral hearing, and the reasons for that preference. The Board may order costs in this proceeding. You must indicate in your letter of intervention whether you expect to seek costs from the applicant and the grounds for your eligibility for costs. You must provide a copy of your letter of intervention to the Applicant.

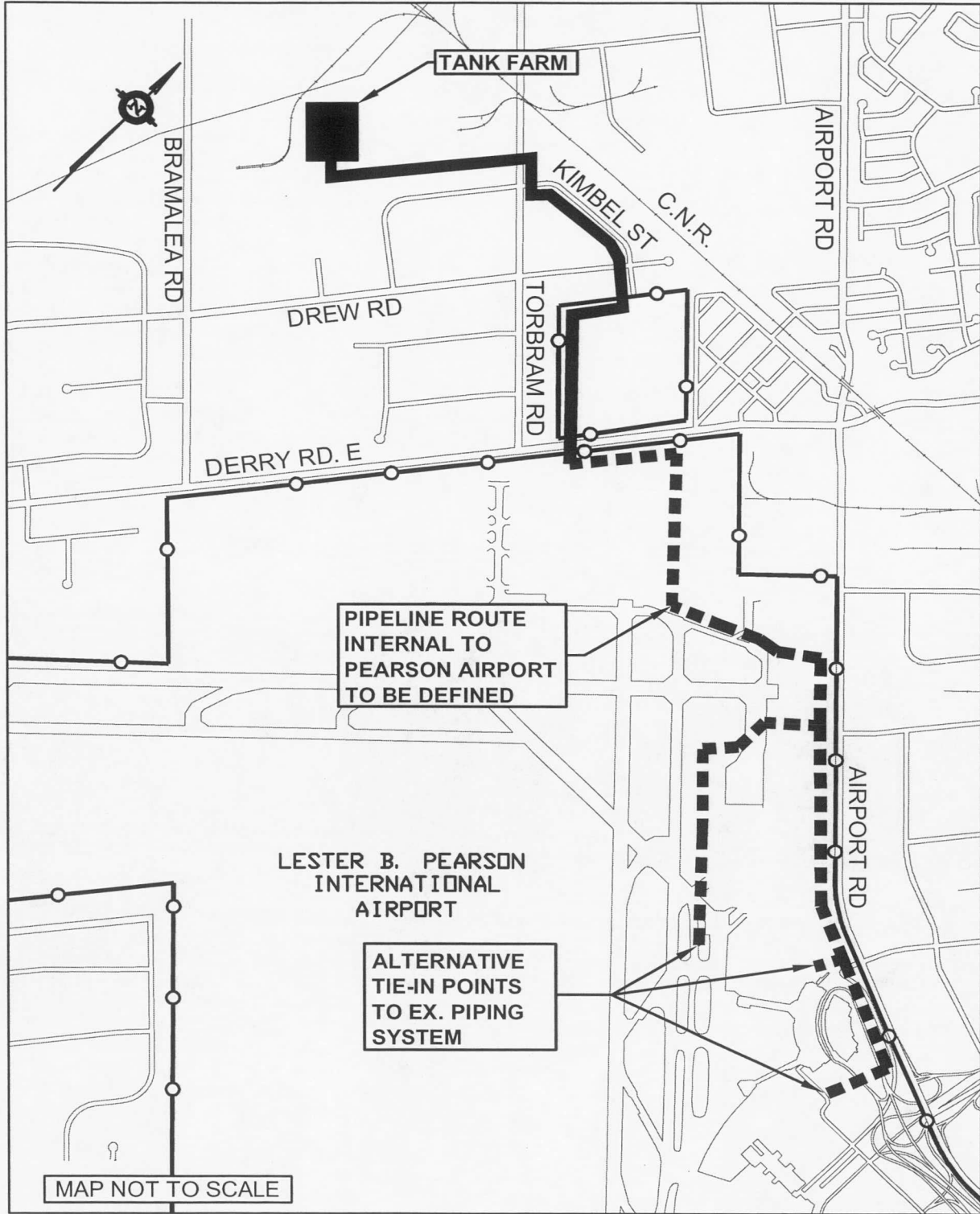
