# ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF HYDRO ONE NETWORKS INC.

Hydro One has applied to change its electricity distribution rates for its Orillia and Peterborough rate zones effective January 1, 2024.

# Learn more. Have your say.

Hydro One has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to change its electricity distribution rates, for its Orillia and Peterborough rate zones, effective January 1, 2024. If the application is approved as filed, a typical residential customer of Hydro One would see the following monthly changes:

	Orillia RZ	Peterborough RZ
Residential	\$8.44	\$0.44
General Service less than 50 kW	\$11.20	(\$4.40)

Other customers, including businesses, may also be affected.

Rate changes between full rate reviews are usually set using an OEB-approved formula which is tied to inflation and other factors intended to promote efficiency. This does not apply to Orillia and Peterborough rate zones as their distribution delivery rates have been frozen. This application also addresses reclassification of post-integration Low Voltage Variance Account transactions to sub-transmission revenue. Hydro One has also requested disposition of certain deferral and variance accounts.

## THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider Hydro One's application for its Orillia and Peterborough rate zones. We will determine whether the company has used the applicable models and formulas required by the OEB and whether to approve Hydro One's request for reclassification of Low Voltage Account transaction. We will also hear questions and arguments from individuals that have registered to participate (called intervenors) in the OEB's hearing. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide what, if any, rate change will be allowed.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

### **BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY**

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review Hydro One's application on the OEB's website now
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing
- You can become an intervenor. As an intervenor, you can ask questions about Hydro
  One's application and make arguments on whether the OEB should approve Hydro One's
  request. Apply by October 12th or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not
  receive any further notice of the proceeding
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website

The OEB intends to consider cost awards in this proceeding that are in accordance with the *Practice Direction on Cost Awards* and only in relation to Hydro One's proposed reclassification of Low Voltage Account transaction and the disposition of certain deferral and variance accounts.

However, your personal telephone number, home address and email address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This rate hearing will be held under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c.15, Schedule B.
