**CONSULTATION ON ENERGY ISSUES RELATING
TO LOW INCOME CONSUMERS**

ENBRIDGE ELECTRIC CONNECTIONS INC.

- **Smart Sub-Metering**
 - Operates behind a local distribution company's bulk meter on private property
 - Can exist in multi-unit condominiums, apartment buildings (*Residential Tenancies Act*), and multi-unit commercial buildings
 - Different unit types have different turnover rates (RTA units have much higher turnover rates (making the identification of low income occupants more difficult)
 - In all types of buildings, there can be a wide variation of income levels
 - Broad array of service offerings by various smart sub-metering companies
 - SSM operates in competitive environment
- **Regulatory Issues**
 - Developers/condominium corporations/RTA building owners are exempt from rate regulation (i.e., exempt distributors)
 - The OEB does not rate regulate smart sub-metering companies
 - Privacy legislation prohibits requiring unit owners to convey income levels
 - Smart sub-metering entities are ill equipped to undertake low income programs or to determine customer eligibility
 - No jurisdiction to require exempt distributors to undertake low income programs
