OEB Proceedings:

Glencore Canada Corporation is an active member of the Association of Major Power Consumers in Ontario and the Industrial Gas Users Association, and generally participates in OEB proceedings through these organizations. In this instance, Glencore has a direct and specific interest in the issues identified below, and seeks to intervene directly.

Issues:

Glencore's Ontario facilities are directly connected to Hydro One's transmission system. As such, Glencore has a direct interest as an electricity transmission customer in a number of the issues being considered in this proceeding.

In particular, Glencore has experience with, and an interest in, charges caused by planned transmission outages (issue 4 on the Commission's list of UTR-related issues as set out in the Notice of a Rate Hearing for this matter recently published). When Glencore Canada

Corporation requires an outage for its primary transmission connection and temporarily takes service through another connection point it incurs charges that are higher than it would incur if the outage did not occur.
