## -- Comments --

Since most of the electricity (hydro) bill is composed by the "delivery" fee, and not the amount of electricity that is used each month by a customer, I don't see enough reasons or logic for the proposed increases. Toronto Hydro does not produce electricity, which flows passively through the network. The "delivery" fee is a source of revenue for the company so that it can pay employees. If there are indeed almost 800 thousand customers of Toronto Hydro, who would pay on average \$40 in "delivery" fees, it means that the company generates more than \$3 million every thirty days. Is this amount of money not enough for the operational costs of the company?
