Re: Ontario Cyber Security Framework Ontario Energy Board File No. EB-2023-0173

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is pleased to share version 1.1 of the Ontario Cyber Security Framework (OCSF) which has been posted on <u>OEB.ca</u>.

First released in 2017, the OCSF is used by electricity transmitters and distributors to assess and report to the OEB, on a common standards basis, their cyber security readiness. Version 1.1 of the OCSF has been prepared by the Cyber Security Advisory Committee (CSAC), an industry-led committee established in 2018 comprised of representatives of Ontario electricity utilities and other stakeholders. The purpose of the CSAC is to provide the OEB with expert advice while simultaneously maintaining and evolving the OCSF.

The OEB appreciates the efforts contributed by CSAC members to produce this update.

Background

The OCSF is based upon the US Department of Commerce's National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) cyber security framework. It has also adopted the US Department of Energy's Cyber Security Capability Model, using four maturity indicators to establish achievement levels. The OCSF integrates privacy principles, including those contained in Canada's Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act.

On December 7, 2023, the CSAC released version 1.1 of the OCSF. Changes made by the CSAC include:

- Updating the list of control objectives to include all NIST 1.1 updates. Among other things, these introduce a supply chain risk management category of control objectives
- Incorporating Cybersecurity Capability Maturity Model version 2.1, and
- Creating illustrative examples for each of the initiated, performed and managed achievement levels.
