# NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR AN ELECTRICITY TRANSMISSION REVENUE REQUIREMENT CHANGE HYDRO ONE NETWORKS INC.

Hydro One Networks Inc. ("Hydro One") has filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") on September 30, 2008 under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, 1998 S.O. c.15, (Schedule B). Hydro One is seeking approval for changes to the uniform provincial transmission rates that Hydro One charges for electricity transmission, to be effective July 1, 2009. The Board has assigned the application Board file number EB-2008-0272.

Hydro One forecasts a revenue requirement of \$1,233 million for 2009 and \$1,341 million for 2010. If the application is approved as filed, the resulting increase in the uniform transmission rate will be 6.4% in 2009 and 12.1% in 2010. For a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month, the estimated increase on the customer's total bill will be 0.5% or \$0.50 in 2009 and 0.9% or \$0.90 in 2010. This increase is in addition to a rate change which will take place on January 1, 2009 ordered by the Board in a separate proceeding.

The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all electricity consumers in Ontario. Any change to the uniform transmission rates will cause the rates charged to consumers through their local distribution companies to change commensurately. Transmission charges (which are determined by the uniform transmission rates) are one of the four regular items that appear on all residential and general service electricity bills.

#### Be prepared for electricity price hikes on Nov. 1

The Ontario Energy Board announced Wednesday that electricity prices in the province are going up.
Beginning Nov. 1, the regulator will allow prices to rise to 5.6 cents per kilowatt hour for up to 1,000 kWh a month. Over that amount, the price rises to 6.5 cents per kWh.

The board estimates the increase will add about \$2.40 a month to a household using 1,000 kWh a month.

There OAB cited a number of reasons for the increase.

These include the costs of new re-newable and natural gas generation projects coming into service and the projects coming into service and the effect of the province's directive to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from coal-fired generating plants by another 33 per cent during the next three

ENWIN Utilities Ltd. has filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board, (the Board) received on September 18, 2008 under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c.15 (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that ENWIN Utilities Ltd. charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2009. The Board has assigned the application File No. EB-2008-0227. The Boards decision on this application may have an effect on all of ENWIN Utilities Ltd.'s customers.

Any change to ENWIN Utilities Ltd.'s distribution rates will cause ENWIN Utilities Ltd.'s delivery charges to change. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers electric bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed.

In its application, ENWIN Utilities Ltd. is seeking approval of \$54,235,554 as the 2009 revenue requirement it requires to provide electricity distribution services. On an equivalent basis, this compares with a Board-approved level of \$49,524,982 for 2006, the last year the rates were reviewed on a cost of service basis. During the interim period, the Board has approved adjustments to distribution rates.

ENWIN Utilities Ltd. indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month would experience an approximate 9.7% increase in their current delivery charges. This is a \$3.80 per month increase on their bill. A general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of less than 50 kW would experience an approximate 7.4% increase in their current delivery charges. This is a \$5.38 per month increase on their bill.
