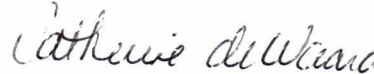

Douro-Dummer Fire Department and the Peterborough County OPP were dispatched to a house fire at 2821 Television Rd. on November 8 at approximately 2:00 a.m.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND HEARING FOR AN ELECTRICITY DISTRIBUTION RATE CHANGE

Peterborough Distribution Inc.

Peterborough Distribution Inc. has filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board, (the "Board") received on October 10, 2008 under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15 (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Peterborough Distribution Inc. charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2009. The Board has assigned the application File No. EB-2008-0241. The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all of Peterborough Distribution Inc.'s customers.

Any change to Peterborough Distribution Inc.'s distribution rates will cause Peterborough Distribution Inc.'s delivery charges to change. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers' electric bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed.

In its application, Peterborough Distribution Inc. is seeking approval of \$15,763,249 as the 2009 revenue requirement it requires to provide electricity distribution services. On an equivalent basis, this compares with a Board-approved level of \$14,851,426 for 2008, the last year the rates were reviewed on a cost of service basis. During the interim period, the Board has approved adjustments to distribution rates.

In addition, Peterborough Distribution Inc. is seeking approval to harmonize the rates it charges within its three service areas of Ashpodel-Norwood, Lakefield and Peterborough. Peterborough Distribution Inc. indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month would experience varying increases in the current delivery charges component of their bill, depending on where they reside as follows:

- In the Ashpodel-Norwood service area, an increase of approximately 9.6% in the current delivery charges. This is an increase of approximately \$3.05 per month on the bill.
- In the Lakefield service area, an increase of approximately 11.3% in the current delivery charges. This is an increase of approximately \$3.53 per month on the bill.
- In the Peterborough service area, an increase of approximately 4.7% in the current delivery charges. This is an increase of approximately \$1.57 per month on the bill.

Similarly, a general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of less than 50 kW would experience varying increases in the current delivery charges component of their bill, depending on where they are located as follows:

- In the Ashpodel-Norwood service area, an increase of approximately 13.8% in the current delivery charges. This is an increase of approximately \$7.83 per month on the bill.
- In the Lakefield service area, an increase of approximately 8.0% in the current delivery charges. This is an increase of approximately \$4.85 per month on the bill.
- In the Peterborough service area, an increase of approximately 11.2% in the current delivery charges. This is an increase of approximately \$8.54 per month on the bill.

Observers do not actively participate in the proceeding but monitor the progress of the proceeding by receiving documents issued by the Board. You may request observer status in order to receive documents issued by the Board in this proceeding. Most documents filed in this application will also be available on the Board's website. This approach will enable the Board to address certain matters more effectively than would be possible in a proceeding conducted entirely on a written basis. If you object to the Board proceeding in this fashion, your letter of intervention must state the nature of the process you believe to be necessary and the reasons for undertaking such a process.

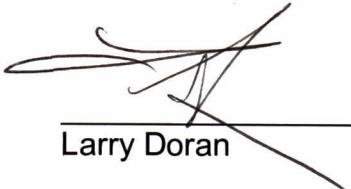
