RE: For Stakeholder Feedback: OEB Staff Discussion Paper Evaluation of Policy on Utility Consolidations Ontario Energy Board File No. EB-2023-0188

Today, the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) posted an OEB Staff Discussion Paper (the Paper) as the next step in the consultation to review and update the OEB's <u>Handbook to</u> <u>Electricity Distributor and Transmitter Consolidations</u> (MAADs Handbook), and associated Filing Requirements for Consolidation Applications. The Paper is available on the OEB's <u>Engage with Us</u> webpage associated with this consultation.¹

The Paper summarizes key comments heard on several consolidation-related topics considered in meetings held with electricity utilities and intervenors. OEB staff's proposals for potential changes to the MAADs Handbook and filing requirements resulting from consideration of the stakeholder comments are also outlined in the Paper.

Background

On July 27, 2023, the OEB issued a <u>letter</u> launching its Evaluation of Policy on Utility Consolidations consultation. The OEB advised that the review will leverage experience to date of the approximately 20 consolidation-related decisions issued since the original MAADs Handbook was published in 2016 and is expected to identify and address any continuing barriers to consolidation, while ensuring customers are protected. This consultation is also expected to address the recommendations related to consolidations as outlined in the Auditor General of Ontario's Value for Money audit report, *Ontario Energy Board: Electricity Oversight and Consumer Protection.*²

The OEB requests that comments be separated under the headings as noted in the Paper for ease of reference.

The OEB will determine next steps for this consultation following its consideration of stakeholder comments.

Cost awards will be available under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* to eligible persons in relation to the provision of comments on the Paper. Costs awarded will be recovered from all licensed rate-regulated electricity distributors.

Appendix A Cost Awards Matters and Filing Instructions

Eligible Activities

Cost awards will be available to participants already determined eligible to apply for an award of costs under the OEB's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards* as per the OEB's August 2023 <u>Decision on Cost Eligibility</u>³ as follows:

Cost Awards

When determining the amount of the cost awards, the OEB will apply the principles set out in section 5 of its *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*. The maximum hourly rates set out in the Cost Awards Tariff will also be applied. The OEB expects that groups representing the same interests or class of persons will make every effort to communicate and co-ordinate their participation in this process. In accordance with section 12 of its *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*, the OEB will act as a clearing house for all payments of cost awards in this process. How to File Materials

All written materials sent to the OEB in response to this letter will be placed on the public record and posted on the OEB's website.
