



## NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND HEARING FOR AN ELECTRICITY DISTRIBUTION RATE CHANGE Horizon Utilities Corporation

Horizon Utilities Corporation has filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board, received on October 22, 2007, under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15 (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Horizon Utilities Corporation charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2008. The Board has assigned the application file number EB-2007-0697. The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all of Horizon Utilities Corporation's customers.

Any change to Horizon Utilities Corporation's distribution rates will cause Horizon Utilities Corporation's delivery charges to change. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers' electric bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed.

Horizon Utilities Corporation is seeking approval of \$94.8 million as the annual revenue it requires to provide electricity distribution. Horizon Utilities Corporation indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month would experience an approximate 0.6% decrease in the electricity bill. A small general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of 50 kW or lower would see an approximate 2.9% increase in the electricity bill.



## AVIS DE REQUÊTE ET D'AUDIENCE DE MODIFICATION DU TARIF DE DISTRIBUTION D'ÉLECTRICITÉ

### d'Horizon Utilities Corporation

Horizon Utilities Corporation a déposé une requête, reçue le 22 octobre 2007, auprès de la Commission de l'énergie de l'Ontario aux termes de l'article 78 de la Loi de 1996 sur la Commission de l'énergie de l'Ontario, L.O., c. 15 (Annexe B) en vue d'obtenir l'approbation de modifier les tarifs qu'Horizon Utilities Corporation exige pour les services de distribution d'électricité, lesquels entrèrent en vigueur le 1<sup>er</sup> mai 2008. La Commission a assigné à la requête le numéro EB-2007-0697. La décision de la Commission concernant cette requête pourrait avoir une incidence sur tous les consommateurs d'Horizon Utilities Corporation.

Toute modification des tarifs de distribution d'Horizon Utilities Corporation entraînera la modification des frais de livraison que cette société exige. Les frais de livraison sont l'un des quatre articles qui figurent systématiquement sur les factures d'électricité des consommateurs résidentiels et des services généraux et qui varient en fonction de la quantité d'électricité consommée.

Horizon Utilities Corporation demande l'approbation de besoins en revenus annuels de 94,8 millions de dollars pour la distribution de l'électricité. Horizon Utilities Corporation indique que si la requête est approuvée telle que déposée, le consommateur résidentiel qui utilise 1 000 kWh par mois constatera une diminution d'environ 0,6 % sur sa facture d'électricité. Le petit consommateur du service général qui utilise 2 000 kWh par mois et dont la demande mensuelle est inférieure à 50 kW verra une augmentation d'environ 2,9 % sur sa facture d'électricité.
