Re: OEB File No. EB-2023-0195, Toronto Hydro-Electric System Limited ("Toronto Hydro")

2025-2029 Custom Rate Application for Electricity Distribution Rates and Charges –

Request for Confidential Treatment of Interrogatory Responses

Pursuant to Rule 10.01 of the OEB's *Rules of Practice and Procedure* and the OEB's *Practice Direction on Confidential Filings* (the "**Practice Direction**"), Toronto Hydro requests that certain information contained in the utility's interrogatory response or documents produced as part of the utility's interrogatory responses be treated as confidential. Toronto Hydro seeks confidential treatment in relation to portions of the documents submitted in response to interrogatories (the "**Responsive Documents**").

The Responsive Documents include information prepared internally by Toronto Hydro, reports prepared by third-parties, and third-party commercial agreements and related billing or payment information. Toronto Hydro also notes that certain portions of the Responsive Documents are permanently redacted for information that is not relevant to answering the question, or information that is covered by solicitor-client privilege.

Descriptions of the particular information contained in the Responsive Documents for which Toronto Hydro seeks confidential treatment and the rationale for the request are set out in the table below. Toronto Hydro notes that many of the requests relate to information that is presumed to be confidential pursuant to Appendix B of the Practice Direction.

Further, Toronto Hydro respectfully request that the Board adopt an interim arrangement with respect to Responsive Documents that consists of commercial agreements with third-parties and related payment information (the "Temporary Confidentiality Requests"). Toronto Hydro has not yet received consent from the third-parties for the disclosure of the agreements and clarification as to what parts of the agreement are confidential (among other things, sensitive commercial and financial information). As a balanced approach to permit that consent and clarification to be obtained and to ensure an open and transparent process, Toronto Hydro requests that this information be treated as fully confidential (other than portions thereof that set out the scope of work) until March 20, 2024. During such time, appropriate clarification will be obtained. By March 20, 2024, Toronto Hydro proposes to re-file the agreements. During this subsequent filing, to the extent that Toronto Hydro has identified additional non-confidential information – based on feedback from the third-party experts – Toronto Hydro will update the public version of the applicable interrogatory responses accordingly.

The information for which Toronto Hydro requests confidential treatment is redacted in the public version of the Application as filed. **Attachment "A"** contains a compilation of the redacted versions (non-confidential) of the relevant documents. **Attachment "B"** contains a compilation of the unredacted (confidential) versions of the relevant documents, each of which is marked "confidential" and highlights the specific portions of the documents for which Toronto Hydro requests confidential treatment. Toronto Hydro has filed the confidential Attachment 'B' with the OEB as a separate electronic document that is marked "confidential". Consistent with the Practice Direction, with the exception to permanent redactions because of legal privilege or irrelevance, it is Toronto Hydro's expectation that access to Attachment "B" — as with any confidential information in this proceeding — will only be available to representatives of parties that have filed Declarations and Undertakings in the prescribed form which have been accepted by the OEB.

The following table describes the particular information for which Toronto Hydro requests confidential treatment and outlines the basis for each of the requests.

Appendix A		Toronto Hydro's consultants are commercial enterprises which, among other services, collect, compile and provide Toronto with access to proprietary industry specific data that is not otherwise in the public domain, as well as analysis based on such proprietary data. This data is of a significant commercial value.
