IMPACT STATEMENT NO. 1

- 1. This exhibit has been filed in order to reflect the impact of changes which are required within Enbridge Gas Distribution's 2008 Earnings Sharing mechanism. The effect of these changes, discussed in more detail in the remainder of this impact statement, is a decrease in the 2008 Actual Year total gross earnings sufficiency of \$0.3 million from \$11.5 million as filed at Exhibit B, Tab 5, Schedule 1 (Filed: 2009-03-18), to \$11.2 million. A detailed summary of the changes within the gross earnings sufficiency calculation is found at Exhibit M, Tab 1, Schedule 2.
- 2. The changes within this impact statement are the result of a required revision in relation to the treatment of Capital Cost Allowance ("CCA") tax related deductions. Within EGD's Fiscal 2008, EB-2007-0615 proceeding, the Board approved a tax savings sharing agreement which contained anticipated changes in the allowable CCA rates for computer equipment (Class 45/50) and distribution assets (Class 1/51). At that time it was anticipated that the allowable CCA rates associated with these classes would increase from 45% to 55% for Class 45 and from 4% to 6% for Class 1, creating Classes 50 and 51 for new additions effective as of March 2007. As a result, 50% of the anticipated related impact was incorporated as a reduction in rates within 2008. There was also an agreed upon provision that the impact of any variance in the anticipated CCA rate changes would be recorded and cleared through a variance account treatment on an annual basis within a Tax Rate and Rule Change Variance Account ("TRRCVA").
- 3. As of the end of EGD's fiscal year 2008, the anticipated changes in the Class 45/50 & 1/51 CCA rates had not been passed into law. As a result, the original EB-2009-0055 filing did not reflect the impact of the previously anticipated CCA rate changes within its financial results and had appropriately recorded an amount to be recovered from ratepayers in a 2008 TRRCVA of \$1.83 million.
- 4. On April 23, 2009, the originally anticipated changes in CCA rates received the necessary Order in Council and were passed into law retroactively, effective to

March 19, 2007. As a result, EGD is now revising its evidence to eliminate the recovery of the 2008 TRRCVA amount of \$1.83 million from the deferral and variance account balances and is appropriately reflecting all of the associated adjustments required within the 2008 year end financial results for earnings sharing purposes. Exhibit A, Tab 2, Schedule 1, Appendix A and Exhibit C, Tab 1, Schedule 1 have been updated to reflect the elimination of the previously established but now no longer required 2008 TRRCVA recovery.

- 5. The original recording of the \$1.83 million TRRCVA at year end required a revenue entry of the same amount as recognition that without the anticipated CCA changes, rates and associated revenue would have been higher. With the current update to eliminate the TRRCVA, there are required adjustments as shown at Exhibit M, Tab 1, Schedule 3, page 1, Lines 1 & 13, to reduce revenue by \$1.8 million and increase the recognition of the Company's share of the agreed tax savings by the same amount.
- 6. In addition to the above noted adjustments, the capital cost allowance rates used in the development of CCA tax deductions within the financial results for earnings sharing calculation purposes must also be adjusted. As shown at Exhibit M, Tab 1, Schedule 3, page 3, Line 6, the impact of this required adjustment results in an increase in CCA tax deductions of \$6.7 million (compared to Exhibit B, Tab 4, Schedule 1, page 3, Line 6). Additionally, as shown at Line 24, the increase in CCA tax deductions results in a reduction to income tax expense of \$3.4 million (compared to Exhibit B, Tab 4, Schedule 1, page 3, Line 24). This change is also shown at Exhibit M, Tab 1, Schedule 3, page 1, Column 2, Line 19.
- 7. In summary, the impact of the CCA rate changes passed into law on Aril 23, 2009 within the EB-2009-0055 filing is as follows:
 - a) the recovery of an amount of \$1.83 million originally recorded in the 2008 TRRCVA, which was set up as a result of the anticipated CCA rate changes not occurring as of the end of fiscal 2008, is no longer required;

- b) subsequently, the total deferral and variance account principal balance for recovery has been reduced by \$1.83 million, from \$27.43 to \$25.6 million as shown at the original and updated Exhibit C, Tab 1, Schedule 1, page 2; and
- c) the associated adjustments required within the financial results for earnings sharing purposes, shown at Schedule 2 of this Impact Statement, change the gross earnings sufficiency at Line 46 from \$11.5 to \$11.2 million and the 50% amount to be returned to ratepayers from \$5.75 to \$5.6 million.

- As approved in EB-2007-0731, the CASDA is to be cleared over 5 years. The first installment was cleared in 2008, therefore
 the second installment is proposed for 2009. As such, 1/4 of the remaining principal, and 1/4 of the remaining interest forecast
 to accumulate through June 30, 2012 is proposed for clearance. The forecast interest is based on the Board's current
 prescribed interest rate for deferral accounts of 1.00% (Q2 2009).

- 1. The deferral and variance accounts, which EGD originally requested clearance of at July 1, 2009 and is now requesting clearance of commencing October 1, 2009, are shown at page 2 of this schedule. The balances requested for clearance total approximately \$25.2 million, which is the combination of principal and interest amounts shown in Columns 3 and 4.
- 2. The update to this exhibit is the result of the 2008 Tax Rate and Rule Change Variance ("TRRCVA") account of \$1.83 million no longer being required for recovery and a related slight change in the 2008 Earnings Sharing Deferral Account. The details of the elimination of the recovery of the 2008 TRRCVA account and the related required adjustments to the 2008 financial and earnings sharing results are explained in evidence at Exhibit M-1-1.
- 3. As shown within the footnotes or evidence referenced in the footnotes on page 2, EGD has provided some additional explanation information for selected accounts. The remaining accounts have either been approved in another proceeding, or have a previously established process which has been followed in determining account balances.
- 4. For example, the DSM related accounts and amounts were approved within the EB-2008-0271 Decision, the DRA amount is the carried-forward amount that was not cleared to ratepayers from prior years' accounts as a result of an inability to locate customers during clearance, the OHCVA is the variance of total actual OEB, intervenor, consulting, legal and other proceeding related costs versus the level embedded in base rates of \$5.84 million, and the URCMVA is
