1. INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY

This is the Decision and Final Rate Order on an application filed by Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. (Newmarket-Tay Power) on November 22, 2023, seeking approval to change its electricity distribution rates effective May 1, 2024.

The OEB has reviewed Newmarket-Tay Power's Draft Rate Order (DRO) and the proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges, which corrected certain numerical errors contained in the OEB's Decision and Order issued on May 7, 2024. The OEB is satisfied with the DRO and proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges and approves them in this Decision and Final Rate Order.

As a result of this Decision and Final Rate Order, there will be a monthly total bill increase for a residential customer consuming 750 kWh as follows:

- For the Newmarket-Tay Rate Zone (RZ), an increase of \$7.04 (5.02%)
- For the Midland RZ, an increase of \$3.91 (2.65%)

This change does not factor in applicable taxes or the Ontario Electricity Rebate.

2. PROCESS AND CONTEXT

On May 7, 2024, the OEB issued its Decision and Order approving Newmarket-Tay Power's request for:

- (i) A price cap adjustment to rates
- (ii) Shared Tax Impacts for the Newmarket-Tay RZ
- (iii) Retail Transmission Service Rates
- (iv)Disposition of the Group 1 Deferral and Variance Account balances (for 2022) on a final basis, except for the balances in Accounts 1588 and 1589 in the Newmarket-Tay RZ, which were to be disposed of on an interim basis
- (v) Disposition of the mechanistically adjusted Lost Revenue Adjustment Mechanism-eligible amounts for the 2024 rate year
- (vi)Partial Incremental Capital Module funding recovery with a 5.60% reduction in the amount claimed for the Newmarket-Tay RZ

The OEB further ordered Newmarket-Tay Power to file a DRO and allowed for comments on the DRO by intervenors¹ and OEB staff.

On May 14, 2024, Newmarket-Tay Power filed its DRO with the OEB. In its DRO, Newmarket-Tay Power indicated, among other things, that the amounts reported for Accounts 1588 and 1589 in the OEB's Decision and Order were inversed. In its Decision and Order, the OEB disallowed recovery of \$38,635². The OEB stated that such disallowance of the principal amount was to reflect, on an overall class basis, the percentage of customers who did not receive credit for amounts that Newmarket-Tay Power had previously recorded in Accounts 1588 and 1589 due to an accounting error. Newmarket-Tay Power submitted that the appropriate amount should have been \$32,409 if the reduction percentages were applied to the requested recovery amounts – \$16,598 for Account 1588 (6.04% x \$274,795) and \$15,811 for Account 1589 (3.20% x \$494,079).³

Newmarket-Tay Power proposed to correct the misallocation of the \$38,635 by applying a reduction of \$19,787 and \$18,848 to Accounts 1588 and 1589, respectively. It also noted that its proposal to correct the arithmetic error would not change the OEB's

approved total reduction and was based on the OEB's intent regarding which customer groups should benefit from the disallowance.⁴

OEB staff agreed that there was an error in the OEB's Decision and Order with respect to Accounts 1588 and 1589 for the Newmarket-Tay RZ and acknowledged Newmarket-Tay Power's willingness to accept the findings for a reduction of \$38,635. However, OEB staff questioned the appropriateness of Newmarket-Tay Power's proposal to absorb the \$6,227 difference due to the error by the OEB in its Decision and Order and requested Newmarket-Tay Power to provide an updated DRO reflecting the intended disallowance of \$32,409 in its reply submission.⁵

CCMBC, SEC, and VECC did not file any comments on the DRO.

Newmarket-Tay Power filed the requested DRO reflecting the intended disallowance of \$32,409 in its reply submission. However, Newmarket-Tay Power re-emphasized its willingness to accept the \$38,635 disallowance and noted that the \$6,226 difference it would be absorbing would be to the benefit of ratepayers and would not have a material impact on the utility. Newmarket-Tay Power further submitted that it had already commenced implementing test rates with the billing vendor based on rates derived from the \$38,635 disallowance and that it would be more administratively burdensome and increase costs to revise the rates to reflect a \$32,409 disallowance, given the timelines to implement rates before the May 1, 2024, billing cycle begins.⁶

3. FINDINGS

The OEB accepts Newmarket-Tay Power's proposal that it would be more administratively burdensome and increase the costs to the utility to revise rates at this point in the Rate Order process to correct the OEB error. As such, the OEB approves Newmarket-Tay Power's proposal to proceed with a disallowance of \$38,635, in respect of the utility's request to adjust balances in Accounts 1588 and 1589 stemming from transactions that occurred in 2021.

The OEB appreciates Newmarket-Tay Power's flexibility in resolving this issue in an efficient manner.

The OEB approves the Tariff of Rates and Charges in Schedule A effective May 1, 2024.

4. ORDER

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Schedule A of this Decision and Final Rate Order is effective **May 1, 2024**. The Tariff of Rates and Charges will apply to electricity consumed or estimated to have been consumed on and after **May 1, 2024**.
- 2. Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than the delivery of the first bill reflecting the new rates.

COST AWARDS

The OEB will issue a separate decision on cost awards once the following steps are completed:

- 1. CCMBC, SEC, and VECC shall submit to the OEB and copy Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. their cost claims no later than **June 6, 2024**.
- 2. Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. may file with the OEB and forward to CCMBC, SEC, and VECC any objections to the claimed costs by **June 13, 2024**.
- CCMBC, SEC, and VECC may file with the OEB and forward to Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. any responses to any objections for cost claims by June 20, 2024.
- 4. Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. shall pay the OEB's costs incidental to this proceeding upon receipt of the OEB's invoice.

Energy is generally supplied as single phase, 3-wire, 60-Hertz, having nominal voltage of 120/240 Volts and up to 400 amps. There shall be only one delivery point to a dwelling. The Basic Connection for Residential consumers is defined as 100 amp 120/240 volt overhead service. A Residential building is supplied at one service voltage per land parcel. Class B consumers are defined in accordance with O. Reg. 429/04. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

SENTINEL LIGHTING SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification refers to privately owned roadway lighting controlled by photo cells. Consumption is based on calculated connected load times the required lighting hours.
