Electric Delivery Rates for Electric Vehicle Charging Proposal and Invitation to Stakeholder Meeting

OVERVIEW

On May 1, 2024, the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) issued a <u>letter</u> to invite stakeholders to a meeting on June 13, 2024 to discuss a proposal for an electricity delivery rate for public EV charging stations that have a low load factor. The letter indicated that cost awards would be available under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, and that any costs would be paid for by licensed electricity distributors. The letter made provision for stakeholders to apply for eligibility and for electricity distributors to object.

The letter added that organizations that had previously been found to be eligible for cost awards in the Electric Vehicle Integration initiative (EB-2023-0071) remain eligible. Those organizations are:

- Building Owners and Managers Association
- Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition
- Coalition of Concerned Manufacturers & Businesses of Canada
- Consumers Council of Canada
- Environmental Defence
- Pollution Probe

After May 1, 2024, the following organizations applied for cost award eligibility:

- Distributed Resource Coalition (DRC)
- School Energy Coalition (SEC)

No objections were received in relation to these requests for cost award eligibility.

OEB FINDINGS

The OEB has determined that, in addition to the six organizations already found to be eligible to apply for an award of costs under this consultation, the DRC and SEC are also eligible to apply for an award of costs under the *OEB's Practice Direction on Cost Awards*.

The OEB reminds eligible participants that cost awards will be available to a maximum of one and a half hours for preparation for the June 13, 2024 stakeholder meeting, three hours for attendance and participation in the meeting, and six hours for written comments on the report (due June 27, 2024).

The OEB further notes that cost-award eligible participants with similar viewpoints should coordinate their activities in order to reduce costs. Such efforts will be taken into account by the OEB during the decision on award of costs.
