Ottawa River Power Corporation ("Ottawa River") has filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board under the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15, Schedule B, for an order of the Board amending Ottawa River's distribution license (ED-2003-0033) to allow an exemption from the requirements of section 3.2 of the Retail Settlement Code ("RSC") and from section 2.2.2 of the Standard Supply Service Code ("SSS").

Section 3.2 of the RSC Code and s. 2.2.2 of the SSS Code do not allow a distributor to purchase power from a generator that is not embedded within its service area. Section 3.2 of the RSC also does not allow a distributor to settle energy sales at a price other than the competitive electricity price as described in Appendix "A" to the RSC (the Hourly Ontario

The application proposes continuing an arrangement whereby Ottawa River purchases approximately 30 percent of its power requirements from the Waltham Generating Station, which is owned by Brookfield Energy Marketing Inc. ("Brookfield Energy") and located in Quebec, about 15 miles from Ottawa River's service area. This arrangement has existed

The current energy supply contract between Brookfield Energy and Ottawa River was established in 2002. Ottawa River sought clarification from the Ontario Energy Board whether its supply arrangements would be permissible going forward. Most documents filed in this application will also be available on the Board's website. Your request for observer status must be made in writing and be received by the Board no later than 10 days from the publication or service date of this notice. You may ask to become an intervenor if you wish to actively participate in the proceeding. Intervenors are eligible to receive evidence and other submitted by participants in the hearing. Likewise, intervenors will be expected to send copies of any material they file to all parties to the hearing.
