Re: Notice of Hearing for Cost Eligibility and Cost Awards

**Natural Gas Demand Side Management**

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is initiating a hearing on its own motion to determine cost awards for eligible Natural Gas Demand Side Management Stakeholder Advisory Group (SAG) and Evaluation Advisory Committee (EAC) members for activities from May 1, 2024, to November 30, 2024.

#### **Background**

On December 8, 2022, the OEB issued <u>a letter</u> initiating the formation of the SAG and updating the EAC. The letter indicated that cost awards would be available to eligible persons under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* (OEB Act) in relation to their participation in the SAG and EAC activities based on the criteria set out in the OEB's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards* (Practice Direction).

On September 3, 2024, the OEB issued a Decision and Order approving cost awards for SAG and EAC activities from November 1, 2023, to April 30, 2024. As part of that Decision, the OEB determined that all participants from the SAG and EAC who filed cost claims met the criteria set out in the OEB's Practice Direction and were eligible for cost awards.

#### **Notice of Hearing**

The OEB is initiating this hearing on its own motion to determine cost awards under section 30 of the OEB Act for eligible DSM SAG and EAC activities that occurred from

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May 1, 2024, to November 30, 2024.<sup>1</sup> The maximum number of hours and eligible SAG activities are outlined in Appendix A of this Notice. The maximum number of hours and eligible EAC activities are outlined in Appendix B of this Notice.

The OEB intends to proceed by way of a written hearing unless a party can satisfy the OEB that there is a good reason for not holding a written hearing. If a party wants to object to a written hearing, the objection must be received by the OEB no later than **seven days** after the date of this Notice.

If the OEB does not receive any objections to a written hearing, the hearing will follow the process set out below.

- SAG and EAC members filing cost claims shall submit their cost claims by January 10, 2025. The cost claim must be filed with the OEB and one copy is to be sent by email to each rate-regulated natural gas distributor. The cost claims must be completed in accordance with section 10 of the OEB's Practice Direction.
- 2. Rate-regulated natural gas distributors will have until **January 17**, **2025** to object to a request for cost awards or any aspect of the costs claimed. The objection must be filed with the OEB and one copy must be sent by email to the person against whose claim the objection is being made.
- 3. The person whose cost claim was objected to will have until **January 24, 2025** to file with the OEB a reply submission as to why its cost claim should be allowed. One copy of the reply submission is to be sent by email to the objecting rate-regulated natural gas distributor(s).
- 4. The OEB will then issue its decision on cost awards. The OEB's costs may also be addressed in the cost awards decision.

The OEB will use the process set out in section 12 of its Practice Direction to implement the payment of the cost awards. The OEB will therefore act as a clearing house for all payments of cost awards in this process.

To address the OEB's costs, including expert DSM evaluation consultant costs, the OEB will proceed by way of progress billing and invoice the distributors on an ad hoc basis. This will ensure timely billing for all parties as the OEB's evaluation activities included within this consultation process can span multiple financial years.
