**Re: Enbridge Gas Inc.
Application for Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity
Township of Amaranth
Ontario Energy Board File No. EB-2025-0134**

Further to the questions submitted by Ontario Energy Board Staff related to the existing CPCNs in the Township of Amaranth area, Enbridge Gas provides the following response.

Staff Question-1

Reference: EB-2025-0134, Application and Evidence, page 1, para 3
EB-2025-0134, Application and Evidence, page 2, para 7

Preamble:

Enbridge Gas stated in the application that on July 1, 1986, a portion of the Township of Amaranth was annexed to the Town of Shelburne pursuant to the *Municipal Boundary Negotiations Act*. Portions of the Township of Amaranth were also annexed by the Town of Shelburne in 1997, 2000 and 2005 pursuant to orders under the *Municipal Act*.

Enbridge Gas also stated that it has franchise agreement with and certificates for the municipalities which are immediately adjacent to the Township of Amaranth, including the Town of Shelburne.

Questions:

- a) Please confirm whether Enbridge Gas's existing certificate for the Town of Shelburne covers the geographic areas annexed from the former Township of Amaranth through municipal reorganizations in 1986, 1997, 2000, and 2005, as described in the application.
- b) Please discuss whether the cancellation of E.B.C. 49 would potentially create any areas outside of the current Township of Amaranth that are not covered by Enbridge Gas's existing certificate authorizations.

Response:

- a) Confirmed. Enbridge Gas' existing CPCN for the Town of Shelburne (EB-2008-0266 – see attached) was issued on September 16, 2008 and replaced those parts of CPCNs E.B.C. 49 and

E.B.C. 57 relating respectively to those parts of the Township of Amaranth and the Township of Melancthon that are now included in the Town of Shelburne and replaced CPCN E.B.C. 51 for the former Village of Shelburne. An application will be submitted in the near future to update the CPCN for the Township of Melancthon.

- b) The E.B.C. 49 CPCN was issued on July 14, 1966 for the Township of Amaranth that existed at that time. Enbridge Gas is not aware of any annexations of parts of the Township of Amaranth to any other municipality other than the Town of Shelburne. Based on the information available, the cancellation of E.B.C. 49 would not create any areas outside of the current Township of Amaranth that are not covered by Enbridge Gas' existing CPCN authorizations.
