The City of Guelph has filed its Community Energy Plan, Community Energy Initiative, Corporate Commitment to Achieve 100% Renewable Energy by 2050, Commitment to the Race to Zero Climate Pledge, Community Call to Climate Action report, Indigenous Relations Framework, Strategic Plan and Official Plan.

Procedural Order No.1 stated "The scope of this proceeding will be focused on the OEB's consideration of Enbridge Gas's request for a new certificate for the City of Guelph, and Enbridge Gas's request for the renewal of its franchise agreement with the City based on the terms and conditions of the Model Franchise Agreement. This proceeding will consider the views of the City and local residents as to whether there are compelling reasons to deviate from the terms and conditions of the Model Franchise Agreement in this City. Broad issues that may have implications for communities and natural gas consumers across Ontario, which are not specific to the City of Guelph, will not be within the scope of this proceeding."

Question(s):

a) Please discuss why the issues raised by the City of Guelph in its filed evidence should be addressed in this proceeding and not a generic proceeding on the Model Franchise Agreement.

The City of Guelph's intervention form states that it proposes revisions to the Model Franchise Agreement in furtherance of the following objectives:

- to provide for flexibility in the event of change in law, including to allow the City of Guelph to charge fees for use of public property if and when Ontario Regulation 584/06 under the Municipal Act, 2001 is amended to allow such charges;
- ensure that the City of Guelph is not liable to pay for any gas infrastructure relocations needed due to conflicts with municipal infrastructure; and
- advocate that any future charges for use of municipal property are not passed on to Guelph customers of the gas distribution company.

As noted in the OEB's Natural Gas Facilities Handbook, "The Model Franchise Agreement provides a template to guide applicants and municipalities regarding the terms that the OEB finds reasonable under the *Municipal Franchises Act*."

Question(s):

- a) Please discuss which specific terms and conditions of the Model Franchise Agreement the City of Guelph seeks amendments to. Please also discuss any unique circumstance(s) about the City of Guelph that warrant a deviation from the terms and conditions in the Model Franchise Agreement.
- b) Please confirm that the City of Guelph is requesting approval to unilaterally change the Model Franchise Agreement if there are any changes in law related to charging fees without coming to the OEB. If confirmed, please describe how this is consistent with the provisions of the *Municipal Franchises Act*.

The City of Guelph has filed evidence pertaining to the costs of relocations and repairs of Enbridge Gas Lines, a list of abandoned Enbridge Gas Lines, an invoice for repairs

and additional work for the Manitoba Street Reconstruction and Inspector notes for the removal of gas lines for the Manitoba Street Reconstruction.

As outlined in the City of Guelph's intervention request and filed evidence, the City of Guelph seeks modified conditions pertaining to infrastructure relocations and the cost sharing provisions in the Model Franchise Agreement.

In the franchise proceeding for the Municipality of Leamington, the OEB stated that "The standard terms that address cost-sharing in the Model Agreement were developed to provide certainty and resolve any dispute in an equitable manner." The OEB also stated that "the Model Agreement, in general, as best meeting the public interest by providing fair treatment of both the civic duties of the Municipality and the fair treatment of Enbridge Gas's ratepayers. This is preferable to a piecemeal approach of negotiating terms specific to a franchise."

Question(s):

a) The cost-sharing provisions and conditions pertaining to infrastructure relocations in the Model Franchise Agreement apply uniformly across the province. Please discuss why it would be in the public interest for the OEB to approve modified cost-sharing provisions and infrastructure relocation provisions for the City of Guelph.
