2. (h) Please describe the applicant's current or intended line of business and business activities.

GridERP Inc. holds an active Certificate of Authorization (CofA) under number 100665863 from Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO). Below is a description of the engineering services provided by the Corporation:

(1) Providing full-service engineering for the design, manufacture, assembly, and warehousing of electrical systems and components, including switchboards, power panels, low-, medium-, and high-voltage switchgear, busway systems, cables, lighting controls, transfer switches, and load centers for both industrial and residential applications. This includes the procurement, manufacturing, final assembly, and distribution of power circuit breakers, molded case circuit breakers, and related components, along with providing power, mechanical, and thermal testing services for electrical protection and control devices. Offering technical consultation, installation, maintenance, repair services, and project management for electrical systems, as well as commissioning and training services.

(2) Supporting the energy, transportation, IT, and industrial sectors through sales, marketing, engineering, design, and R&D services, along with procurement, site installation, and post-sales support. Providing expertise in energy aggregation, sustainability initiatives, energy efficiency programs, environmental compliance, impact assessments, and supply chain practices.

(3) Developing software products and systems for grid management, digitization, and IoT, along with consulting for power and energy systems. Offering IT and OT infrastructure security solutions, including cybersecurity governance, data protection, cloud services, incident response, business continuity planning, and third-party vendor management.

(4) Delivering comprehensive solutions for low-, medium-, and high-voltage power and energy systems, including power plants, transformers, substations, renewable energy sources, battery storage, SCADA systems, and energy management systems. Services cover project management, procurement, design, construction, installation, maintenance, lifecycle management, risk assessments, and safety training, with a focus on health and safety, PPE management, audits, and OH&S practices.

(5) Providing energy optimization strategies through the integration of renewable energy, energy efficiency initiatives, performance monitoring, and energy audits, aimed at improving operational efficiency and sustainability.

At the time of filing, the Corporation is wholly owned and operated by a single founder, and no additional personnel, subsidiaries, or affiliate entities—licensed electric suppliers or otherwise—currently exist within its corporate structure. The company hired a qualified accountant as the VP of Finance. The provided chart uploaded in Section 11(a) is not intended to represent an existing affiliate network or layered ownership arrangement. Rather, it served to illustrate the Corporation's long-term organizational planning once operational activities expand and personnel are hired. The Corporation affirms that it will not hire or retain any individual currently employed by or affiliated with a licensed electric supplier serving Ontario.

At this stage, the Corporation is in the pre-operational phase and is actively focused on business formation, compliance planning, and operational readiness. This includes securing the necessary licensing from the Ontario Energy Board (OEB), developing internal systems and procedures aligned with regulatory requirements, and preparing to deliver electricity retailing services upon approval. The

applicant has not entered into any agreements with consumers, retailers, or distributors and has not commenced any form of solicitation, marketing, or contractual activity related to electricity sales or brokerage. All retailing activities, including those involving renewable energy under Power Purchase Agreements or net metering arrangements, will begin only after the appropriate regulatory authorizations are in place and all operational safeguards have been fully established. This approach reflects the applicant's commitment to full regulatory compliance and responsible market entry.

9. (e) Describe in detail the applicant's current or intended business model and product offering(s). Include details of all products the applicant intends to offer to its customers and explain how the commodity pricing will be determined for each of the applicant's product offering.

The Corporation intends to operate as both an electricity retailer and an energy broker in Ontario, serving low-volume (less than 150,000 kWh annually) and large-volume (more than 150,000 kWh annually) electricity consumers. The business model is built on a customer-centric, flexible approach designed to offer competitive pricing, transparent contract terms, and value-added services tailored to various consumer classes.

1. Direct Electricity Sales (Retailing): The Corporation will offer fixed-rate and custom-structured electricity supply contracts to both residential/small business (low-volume) and commercial/industrial (large-volume) consumers. These contracts will be:

- Fixed-Term: Typically ranging from 1 to 5 years.
- Fixed-Price: Pricing will be determined based on wholesale market rates (HOEP), forecasted load, and hedging costs, combined with a reasonable margin to cover risk and administrative overhead.
- Custom Pricing (for large-volume customers): Pricing will be based on load profiling, market trends, and customer-specific usage patterns, allowing for more customized and competitive rates.

Pricing for all product offerings will be transparently disclosed, including breakdowns of supply charges, administrative fees, and any additional service-related costs, in compliance with OEB consumer protection regulations.

2. Renewable Energy Contracts under Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs): The Corporation also plans to offer electricity generated from renewable energy sources (e.g., solar or wind) to both low- and large-volume customers. These will be structured as Power Purchase Agreements, where customers agree to purchase electricity directly from a renewable generation facility. The Corporation will act as the electricity retailer in these transactions.

- For customers participating in net metering, the Corporation will coordinate with the local distribution company (LDC) to facilitate crediting of excess generation.
- Pricing for these agreements will be determined on a fixed per-kWh rate over the contract term, based on generation cost, infrastructure investment, and long-term power purchase forecasts.

3. Brokerage Services: The Corporation will also operate as a broker or agent, facilitating electricity contracts between consumers and licensed retailers. These services will include:

- Helping consumers assess competitive electricity plans.
- Acting as a third-party advisor in contract negotiations.
- Providing post-sale support and guidance on contract terms.

As a broker, the Corporation will not directly set the commodity pricing but will ensure that any retailer products offered through its brokerage are compliant with OEB regulations and fully transparent.
