Dear Mr. Murray,

I apologize for the delay in responding to the Interrogatory from Enbridge Gas regarding my Affidavit of July 23, 2025:

“Enbridge Gas’ understanding is that Tay Valley Township’s population is currently 5,925. Please provide details of how many of these residents are located within each of the former townships of Bathurst, North Burgess and South Sherbrooke.”

While Statistics Canada provides 5,925 as the total population for the Township, it does not provide population information by the former geographic townships.

Therefore, we used our GIS system and property codes from the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation to identify all permanent residential properties (including farms with residence, etc., but not including seasonal dwellings). We then located the properties by the former geographic townships. Then we multiplied the number of properties by 2.45 (average persons per dwelling for Tay Valley Township). The numbers will be a bit low since a multi-unit building would only count as one property. But we only have two multi-unit dwellings and the largest one only has 8 units in it. The population by former geographic townships is shown below:

North Burgess – 1,782
South Sherbrooke – 1,021
Bathurst – 3,089

Total population by this method = 5,892. These numbers are consistent with our on the ground knowledge of the Township wards. South Sherbrooke has a much lower population than North Burgess and Bathurst has the most permanent residential properties.
