I am a residential customer of Alectra Utilities, residing in Mississauga, Ontario within the Enersource rate zone. I am writing to address the proposed electricity distribution rate increase that is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2027.

The notice indicates that residential customers in my area can expect a monthly increase of approximately \$3.41. While this amount may seem modest in isolation, it is part of a broader pattern of ongoing increases over recent years. This trend contributes to growing financial pressure for many households, particularly now when inflation and living costs are significantly higher.
