Dear Ms. McLean:

Thank you for your letter of October 24, 2008, to the Honourable George Smitherman, Minister of Energy and Infrastructure, regarding stray voltage and wind generators. The Minister has asked me to respond on his behalf.

This Ministry has no record of previous correspondence from you to Minister Smitherman on this topic. I am aware of an e-mail from you to the Minister of the Environment on this subject, sent August 13, 2008; this Ministry was copied on the Ministry of Environment's response.

As noted in that response, stray voltage is not unique to distribution systems near wind farms; in fact, stray voltage occurs to a greater or lesser extent on almost all distribution systems in Ontario. Also, while stray voltage can adversely affect farm animals, particularly dairy cows, it is not considered hazardous to humans.

Please be aware that this Ministry does not have a mandate to investigate questions relating to possible health risks, or questions relating to electrical safety. For information on electrical safety, you should contact the Electrical Safety Authority, which is responsible for electrical safety matters in Ontario (website: http://www.esainspection.net).
