#### What You Need to Know

- The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is introducing a one-day issues meeting as part of its new Small Distributor Process for cost of service applications.
- This streamlined process is designed to reduce regulatory burden and simplify the review for small electricity distributors.
- Chapter 2 of the Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications will be updated to include the acceptance criteria for the Small Distributor Process, applicable to electricity distributors submitting 2027 rate applications.

# Item 9 – Continuing savings, efficiencies, and reduced regulatory burden for small utilities

The OEB is advancing Item 9 of its 10-point Action Plan (the Plan), part of its September 2024 Report Back to the Minister on <u>Intervenors and Regulatory Efficiency</u> (the Report). Both the Plan and Report are aligned with the 2024 Minister's <u>Letter of Direction</u>, which emphasizes regulatory efficiency as a priority for the OEB to enable Ontario's economic growth.

In line with recommendations from the <u>Very Small Utilities Working Group Report</u>, the OEB piloted process changes to reduce regulatory burden for very small distributors – those with fewer than 5,000 customers – as part of the Very Small Distributors Pilot (formerly the Very Small Utilities Pilot). The pilot included five cost of service applications for 2024/2025 rates.

The use of a one-day issues meeting improved communication and reduced the number of questions from OEB staff and intervenors compared to previous proceedings.

### Small Distributor Process

Based on the outcomes of the pilot, the OEB will broaden the availability of the one-day issues meeting option. This streamlined approach will now be automatically available to all very small electricity distributors, and qualifying small electricity distributors – those serving between 5,000 and 30,000 customers – under the newly established **Small Distributor Process**. Eligibility for small electricity distributors will take into consideration the following criteria:

- a) Subtotal A bill impacts are less than 10%
- b) Total bill impacts are less than 10%
- c) There is no request for an Advanced Capital Module or a true-up of a past Incremental Capital Module
- d) Based on past applications of a similar nature, there are expected to be three intervenors or less in the proceeding
- e) Requests for an investment(s) in unique or emerging areas such as non-wire solutions, electric vehicles, Distributed Energy Resources, electrification, Vulnerability and System Hardening, or similar matters
- f) The evidence does not raise unique issues or requests that have not been previously adjudicated by the OEB in a cost of service proceeding

If distributors are unsure whether they meet the criteria, they are encouraged to reach out to the Registrar's Office for assistance.

## Next Steps

The OEB will update the Chapter 2 Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Cost of Service Rate Applications – 2026 Edition for 2027 Rate Applications to include the acceptance criteria for the Small Distributor Process.
