**Re: Enbridge Gas Inc. (Enbridge Gas or the Company)
Ontario Energy Board (OEB) File: EB-2025-0313
Cedar Springs Community Expansion Project (the Project)
Enbridge Gas Response to Intervention Request dated February 2, 2026, from Six
Nations of the Grand River (SNGR) Elected Council (SNGREC)**

Enbridge Gas has reviewed the two letters from SNGREC filed with the OEB each dated February 2, 2026, one requesting cost recovery for SNGR's participation as an intervenor in the above-noted proceeding, and the other outlining a number of concerns regarding Enbridge Gas's engagement on the Project.

Enbridge Gas does not object to SNGR intervening in the proceeding.

Importantly, it is Enbridge Gas's position that the concerns noted in SNGREC's request paint an incomplete picture of the Company's engagement with SNGR to date on the Project. In particular, Enbridge Gas takes issue with the broad statement in the request that "no consultation whatsoever has occurred on this file." Enbridge Gas expects that additional details of the engagement undertaken with SNGR will emerge through the discovery phase of this proceeding; however, Enbridge Gas wishes to highlight a few key steps it has taken which, when added to the record, will help present a more balanced view of the attempts Enbridge Gas has made to engage with SNGR on the Project to date.

At the outset, Enbridge Gas takes accountability for some technical issues that occurred during the sharing of key documents early in the engagement process. Enbridge Gas now understands that SNGR is in receipt of all material Project documentation that has been prepared, including the Environmental Report. The Company has reached out to SNGR to request any comments SNGR may have on this documentation. In addition, Enbridge Gas has also made requests to SNGR to meet in respect of the Project. Enbridge Gas is awaiting SNGR's response to each of these requests and will consider any comments provided or proposed times to meet.

As it relates to field work, SNGR was provided with the opportunity to participate in initial archaeology field work and, although the community executed a monitoring agreement with Enbridge Gas to participate in Project field work, they ultimately decided not to attend. Prior to this work being completed, a representative of SNGR attended a field verification survey at the proposed Project site, and Enbridge Gas is in the process of paying the invoice that was received in relation to the representative's time.

The Company has reached out to SNGR to seek their input, involvement and engagement on the Project, and will actively continue to do so. Enbridge Gas welcomes any ideas that SNGR may have to improve this engagement.

Enbridge Gas has made an offer of capacity funding and notes that the offer is still available. Enbridge Gas will reach out again to SNGR to discuss its funding capacity needs, so that any appropriate capacity funding can be provided to SNGR.

As is Enbridge Gas's practice, engagement will continue throughout this proceeding and for the lifecycle of the Project to address any potential impacts on SNGR's Aboriginal and treaty rights, as appropriate.
