Issues:

Pollution Probe represents a consumer and policy interest in this 2027-2030 Demand Side Management (DSM) proceeding. This proceeding is an outcome from several OEB proceedings and related decisions (details included in Enbridge's application), including EB-2021-0002 and EB-2024-0198. These relevant OEB decisions directed Enbridge to file an enhanced DSM plan, including certain specific relevant elements (e.g. expected DSM results, cost of carbon considerations, etc.). There is no Issues List at this time for this proceeding, but Pollution Probe expects that the OEB will follow a similar approach through a formal oral hearing process. The draft Issues List should include the standard issues included by the OEB when reviewing a multi-year DSM plan, plus items to address the specific requirements and directions outlined in the EB-2021-002 and EB-2024-0198 decisions. DSM programs also have a direct relationship to natural gas integrated resource planning (IRP) and it is recommended that the OEB also consider if the proposed DSM plan will enable successful IRP outcomes, or what DSM plan changes will be needed to do so. Enbridge recommends that the OEB adopt the already-approved intervenor list and Issues List from EB-2024-0198. Pollution Probe believes that this is an efficient approach and the OEB can consider any additional requests, should they be submitted. Cost of carbon has been an integrated consideration for DSM since DSM was established in the early 1990s. Given the significance of this item on the cost-effectiveness of DSM programs, it is recommended that the OEB find

an appropriate way to ensure that the cost of carbon is adequately integrated into the proceeding (i.e. procedurally and per the Issues List).

Policy Interests:

As noted above, Pollution Probe represents a consumer and policy interest which includes ensuring that the proposed DSM programs provide maximum savings in a cost-effective and coordinated manner. Pollution Probe also coordinates across multiple stakeholders in Ontario on these policy issues and partners with other not-for-profit organizations and stakeholders to engage and coordinate input into the process.

Hearings:

The OEB has typically leveraged an oral hearing process for multi-year DSM applications. This approach is recommended given the scale and impact of the application.

Evidence:

Pollution Probe does not intend to commission expert evidence at this time. However, based on the issues outlined in the application Pollution Probe may provide relevant materials to the OEB during the proceeding. No specific approvals are required to enable this approach. If anything changes, Pollution Probe will notify the OEB.

Coordination with Other Intervenors:

Pollution Probe has been an active and valuable participant in OEB proceedings and will continue to coordinate its activities with impacted consumers, intervenors and other parties as appropriate.

Cost Awards:

Pollution Probe respectfully requests your acceptance of this intervenor request and confirmation that it will be eligible for its costs. Pollution Probe is a not-for-profit charitable organization.
