1. OVERVIEW

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is approving changes to the rates that ERTH Power Corporation (ERTH Power) charges to distribute electricity to its customers, effective May 1, 2026.

ERTH Power maintains two separate rate zones¹, referred to as the Main Rate Zone and Goderich Rate Zone. As a result of this Decision and Rate Order, there will be monthly total bill increases of \$1.81 in the Main Rate Zone and \$2.76 in the Goderich Rate Zone for a residential customer with a monthly consumption of 750 kWh. This change does not factor in applicable taxes or the Ontario Electricity Rebate.

2. CONTEXT AND PROCESS

ERTH Power filed its application on October 30, 2025 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* and in accordance with [Chapter 3 \(Incentive Rate-Setting Applications\)](#) of the OEB's *Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications* (Filing Requirements). The application was based on the Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (Price Cap IR) option.

The Price Cap IR option is one of three incentive rate-setting mechanisms (IRM) used by the OEB.² It involves the setting of rates through a cost of service application in the first year and mechanistic price cap adjustments which may be approved through IRM applications in each of the ensuing adjustment years.

The OEB follows a standardized and streamlined process for processing IRM applications filed under Price Cap IR. In each adjustment year of a Price Cap IR term, the OEB prepares a Rate Generator Model that includes, as a placeholder, information from the distributor's past proceedings and annual reporting requirements. The distributor then reviews, completes, and includes the model with its application, and may update the model during the proceeding to make any necessary corrections or to incorporate new rate-setting parameters as they become available.

ERTH Power serves approximately 25,000 mostly residential and commercial electricity customers in the municipalities of Aylmer, Port Stanley, Belmont, Ingersoll, Thamesford, Otterville, Norwich, Burgessville, Beachville, Embro, Tavistock, Clinton, Mitchell, Dublin, and Goderich.

The application was supported by pre-filed written evidence and completed Rate Generator Models and, as required during the proceeding, ERTH Power updated and clarified the evidence

3. DECISION OUTLINE

Each of the following issues is addressed in this Decision and Rate Order, together with the OEB's findings.

- Annual Adjustment Mechanism
- Shared Tax Adjustments
- Retail Transmission Service Rates
- Low Voltage Service Rates

- Group 1 Deferral and Variance Accounts

Instructions for implementing ERTH Power's new rates and charges are set out in the final section of this Decision and Rate Order.

This Decision and Rate Order does not address rates and charges approved by the OEB in prior proceedings, such as specific service charges³ and loss factors, which are out of the scope of an IRM proceeding and for which no further approvals are required to continue to include them on the distributor's Tariff of Rates and Charges.

4. ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

ERTH Power has applied to change its rates, effective May 1, 2026. The proposed rate change is based on a mechanistic rate adjustment using the OEB-approved **inflation minus X-factor** formula applicable to IRM applications. The adjustment applies to distribution rates (fixed and variable) uniformly across all customer classes.⁴

The components of the Price Cap IR adjustment formula applicable to ERTH Power Corporation are set out in the table below. Inserting these components into the formula results in a 3.40% increase to ERTH Power's rates: **3.40% = 3.70% - (0.00% + 0.30%)**.

An inflation factor of 3.70% applies to all IRM applications for the 2026 rate year. The X-factor is the sum of the productivity factor and the stretch factor. It is a productivity offset that varies among different groupings of distributors. Subtracting the X-factor from inflation ensures that rates decline in real, constant-dollar terms, providing distributors with a tangible incentive to improve efficiency or else experience declining net income. The productivity component of the X-factor is based on industry conditions over a historical study period and applies to all IRM applications for the 2026 rate year. The stretch factor component of the X-factor is one of five stretch factor groupings established by the OEB, ranging from 0.00% to 0.60%. The stretch factor assigned to any distributor is based on the distributor's total cost performance as benchmarked against other distributors in Ontario.

Findings

ERTH Power's request for a 3.40% rate increase is in accordance with the annually updated parameters set by the OEB. The adjustment is approved, and ERTH Power's new rates for the Main Rate Zone and Goderich Rate Zone shall be effective May 1, 2026.

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5. SHARED TAX ADJUSTMENTS

In any adjustment year of an IRM term, a change in legislation may result in a change to the amount of taxes payable by a distributor.⁸ ⁹ OEB policy is that the impacts of such legislated tax changes are shared equally between shareholders and customers.¹⁰ The shared tax change amount, whether in the form of a credit or a debit, will be assigned to customer rate classes in the same proportions as the OEB-approved distribution revenue by rate class from the distributor's last cost of service proceeding.

For the Main Rate Zone, ERTH Power identified a total tax decrease of \$6,741, resulting in a shared amount of \$3,370 to be refunded to ratepayers. For the Goderich Rate Zone, ERTH Power identified a total tax decrease of \$6,503, resulting in a shared amount of \$3,252 to be refunded to ratepayers.

This allocated tax sharing amount does not produce a rate rider to the fourth decimal place, for either rate zone, in one or more rate classes. In such situations where the Rate Generator Model does not compute rate riders, distributors are required to transfer the entire OEB-approved tax sharing amount into the Disposition and Recovery of Regulatory Balances Control Account (Account 1595) for disposition at a later date.

Findings

The OEB approves the tax sharing credit amounts of \$3,370 for the Main Rate Zone and \$3,252 for the Goderich Rate Zone.

As the allocated tax sharing amounts cannot be accommodated through rate riders in 2026, which are only set to four decimal places, in one or more rate classes, the OEB directs ERTH Power to record the credit amounts of \$3,370 for the Main Rate Zone and \$3,252 for the Goderich Rate Zone in Account 1595 (2026).

6. RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES

In Ontario, some distributors are connected directly to a licensed transmitter, while others may be embedded, or partially-embedded, within the distribution system of another licensed distributor. ERTH Power's Main Rate Zone is partially embedded within Hydro One Networks Inc.'s (Hydro One) distribution system, while the Goderich Rate Zone is connected directly to a licensed transmitter. As a result, ERTH Power's Retail Transmission Service Rates (RTSRs) will reflect both Uniform Transmission Rates (UTRs) and host distributor RTSRs.

To recover its cost of transmission services, ERTH Power requests approval to adjust the RTSRs that it charges its customers in accordance with the UTRs and host distributor RTSRs currently in effect.^{11 12}

On March 31, 2025, the OEB issued a report on the design of a new Electric Vehicle Charging Rate (EVC Rate), *Electric Vehicle Charging Rate Overview – Final Report*. The EVC Rate reduces the RTSRs that participating electric vehicle charging stations pay. The report requires electricity distributors to begin offering the EVC Rate to eligible customers in 2026, once their OEB-approved 2026 distribution rates become effective.

Findings

ERTH Power's proposed adjustment to its RTSRs is approved.

The RTSRs have been adjusted based on the current OEB-approved UTRs and host-RTSRs.

UTRs and host-RTSRs are typically approved annually by the OEB. In the event that the OEB updates the approved UTRs and host-RTSRs during ERTH Power's 2026 rate year, any resulting differences (from the prior-approved UTRs and host-RTSRs) will be captured in Retail Settlement Variance Accounts 1584 (Retail Transmission Network Charge) and 1586 (Retail Transmission Connection Charge).

In accordance with the OEB's March 31, 2025 report, ERTH Power will provide eligible electric vehicle charging station customers with the option to elect to be charged the RTSRs on the basis of the EVC Rate.

7. LOW VOLTAGE SERVICE RATES

ERTH Power's Main Rate Zone is partially embedded within Hydro One's distribution system. In its application, ERTH Power has requested approval to update its Low Voltage Service Rates for the Main Rate Zone.

Low voltage transactions, which are not part of the wholesale electricity market, are charged to a distributor by its host distributor(s). To recover the cost of its low voltage transactions, ERTH Power requests approval to adjust its Low Voltage Service Rates that it charges its customers as part of this IRM application. The adjusted Low Voltage Service Rates are based on the current OEB-approved host distributor sub-transmission rates and the most recent demand data for low voltage transactions.

Findings

ERTH Power's proposed adjustments to its Low Voltage Service Rates are approved. These rates have been updated based on the current OEB-approved host distributor's sub-transmission rates. In the event that the OEB updates the approved host distributor sub-transmission rates during ERTH Power's 2026 rate year, any resulting differences are to be captured in Account 1550 (LV Variance Account).

8. GROUP 1 DEFERRAL AND VARIANCE ACCOUNTS

In each year of an IRM term, the OEB will review a distributor's Group 1 deferral and variance accounts to determine whether those balances should be disposed of. OEB policy states that Group 1 account balances should be disposed of if they exceed, on a net basis (as a debit or credit), a pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh, unless a distributor can justify why balances should not be disposed of.¹³ If the net balance does not exceed the threshold, a distributor may still request disposition.¹⁴

Main Rate Zone

The 2024 year-end net balance for ERTH Power's Main Rate Zone Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to April 30, 2026, is a debit of \$1,468,855, and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2024 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0030 per kWh, which exceeds the pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh.

ERTH Power has requested disposition of this amount over a one-year period.

Included in the Group 1 accounts are certain variances related to costs that are paid for by a distributor's customers. Customers pay different costs, depending on their classification. "Class A" customers, who participate in the Industrial Conservation Initiative, pay for Global Adjustment (GA) charges based on their contribution to the five highest Ontario demand peaks over a one-year period. "Class B" customers pay for GA charges based on their monthly consumption, either as a standalone charge or embedded in the Regulated Price Plan (RPP).¹⁵ A similar mechanism applies to Class A and Class B customers for Capacity Based Recovery (CBR) charges.¹⁶ The balance in the GA variance account is attributable to non-RPP Class B customers and is disposed of through a separate rate rider. The balance in the CBR Class B variance account is attributable to all Class B customers.

ERTH Power had one or more Class A customers in the Main Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the CBR

Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

During the period in which variances accumulated, the Main Rate Zone had one or more customers transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances that are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying the debits (or receiving credits) for their disposal. ERTH Power has proposed to allocate a portion of the GA and CBR Class B balances to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels.¹⁷ The amounts allocated to each transition customer are proposed to be recovered by way of 12 equal monthly installments charges/payments.

Findings – Main Rate Zone

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements*.

The OEB approves the disposition of a debit balance of \$1,468,855 as of December 31, 2024, including interest projected to April 30, 2026, for Group 1 accounts on final basis for the Main Rate Zone.

Table 8.1 identifies the principal and interest amounts, which the OEB approves for disposition.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and interest carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors*.¹⁸ The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances for the Main Rate Zone to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from May 1, 2026 to April 30, 2027.¹⁹

Goderich Rate Zone

The 2024 year-end net balance for ERTH Power's Goderich Rate Zone Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to April 30, 2026, is a debit of \$171,500, and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2024 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0012 per kWh, which exceeds the pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh.

ERTH Power has requested disposition of this amount over a one-year period.

ERTH Power had one or more Class A customers in the Goderich Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the CBR Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

Findings – Goderich Rate Zone

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements*.

The OEB approves the disposition of a debit balance of \$171,500 as of December 31, 2024, including interest projected to April 30, 2026, for Group 1 accounts on final basis for the Goderich Rate Zone.

Table 8.2 identifies the principal and interest amounts, which the OEB approves for disposition.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and interest carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the

Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors.²⁰ The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances for the Goderich Rate Zone to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from May 1, 2026 to April 30, 2027.²¹

9. IMPLEMENTATION

This Decision and Rate Order is accompanied by Rate Generator Models, applicable supporting models, and a Tariff of Rates and Charges (Schedule A). The Rate Generator Models also incorporate the following regulatory rates and charges set out in Table 9.1.

Each of the rates is a component of the “Regulatory Charge” on a customer’s bill and established separately by the OEB. The RRRP and WMS rates were set by the OEB on December 11, 2025.²²

The Smart Metering Entity Charge is a component of the “Distribution Charge” on a customer’s bill, established by the OEB through a separate order. The Smart Metering Entity Charge was set by the OEB on September 8, 2022.²³

The Standard Supply Service Charge is a monthly fee set by the OEB that covers the administrative costs of an electricity distributor when a customer buys power directly from them under the RPP instead of a third-party energy retailer. This fixed charge is uniform across all utilities in the province and is in addition to the Wholesale Market Service charge.

In the *Report of the Board: Review of Electricity Distribution Cost Allocation Policy*,²⁴ the OEB indicated that it will review the default province-wide microFIT charge annually to ensure it continues to reflect actual costs in accordance with the established methodology. On November 27, 2025, the OEB issued a letter advising electricity distributors that the microFIT charge shall continue to be \$5.00 for the duration of the 2026 rate year (May 1, 2026 to April 30, 2027).²⁵

10. ORDER

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT

1. The Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Schedule A of this Decision and Rate Order is approved effective May 1, 2026 for electricity consumed or estimated to have been consumed on and after such date. ERTH Power Corporation shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than the delivery of the first bill reflecting the new rates.
2. In accordance with the OEB's March 31, 2025 report, *Electric Vehicle Charging Rate Overview – Final Report*, ERTH Power Corporation will, as of May 1, 2026, provide eligible customers with the option to elect to be charged Retail Transmission Service Rates on the basis of the Electric Vehicle Charging Rate, subject to the standard terms and conditions set out in Appendix A of the report.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification refers to the supply of electrical energy to customers residing in residential dwelling units. Class B consumers are defined in accordance with O. Reg. 429/04. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable. In addition, the charges in the MONTHLY RATES AND CHARGES - Regulatory Component of this schedule do not apply to a customer that is an embedded wholesale market participant.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges, assessments, or credits that are required by law to be invoiced by a distributor and that are not subject to Ontario Energy Board approval, such as the Global Adjustment and the HST.

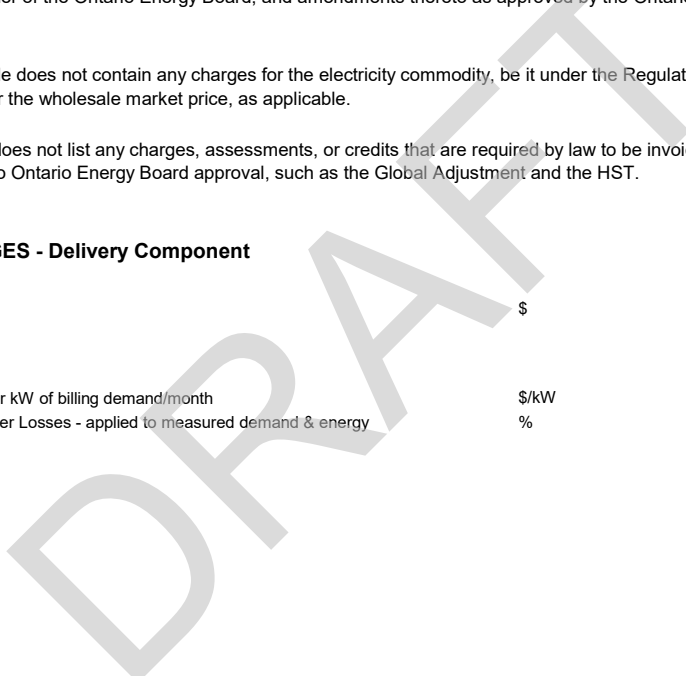
