**Re: GridERP Inc. (GridERP)  
Motion for Review and Variance  
OEB File No.: EB-2025-0239**

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) acknowledges receipt of the notice of motion filed by GridERP on March 6, 2026, seeking review and variance of the OEB's decision and order (Decision) denying GridERP a licence to retail electricity (EB-2025-0239).

While not specified, the OEB understands GridERP's notice as seeking a motion to review and vary the Decision pursuant to Part 7 of the OEB's [Rules of Practice and Procedure](#) (OEB Rules). However, the Decision was made by an employee of the OEB under authority delegated to him pursuant to section 6 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* (OEB Act). As such, the OEB Rules pertaining to motions to review are not applicable in this case<sup>1</sup>.

Instead, section 7(1) of the OEB Act provides for an appeal to the Board of an order made under delegated authority.

The OEB therefore proposes to treat this motion as an appeal under section 7(1) of the OEB Act. An OEB panel will be assigned to consider the appeal, and may confirm, vary or cancel the Decision.

If GridERP has any objections to the proposed approach, GridERP may advise the undersigned by March 20, 2026. If no objections are received by that date, the OEB will proceed on that basis and will communicate the next steps in due course.
