**Re: Orangeville Hydro Limited
Application for 2026 Electricity Distribution Rates – EB-2025-0015
Draft Rate Order**

As per the Decision and Order dated March 31, 2026 (“the Decision”), Orangeville Hydro submits a Draft Rate Order (“DRO”) with a proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges that reflect the Ontario Energy Board’s (“OEB’s”) findings in the Decision.

The DRO, submitted electronically through the OEB’s web portal (“RESS”), is supported by the following files, which includes detailed information as to how Orangeville Hydro calculated these final rates.

Updated Excel files to support the Draft Rate Order for this IRM application:

- OHL_2026-IRM-Rate-Generator-Model_V1_20260407

Orangeville Hydro used the updated IRM Rate Generator Model, which reflects the approved issues in the Decision and Order, specifically:

- Annual Adjustment Mechanism
- Revenue-to-Cost Ratio Adjustments
- Shared Tax Adjustments
- Retail Transmission Service Rates
- Low Voltage Service Rates

In accordance with the Decision, the Draft Rate Order reflects:

1. Group 1 Deferral and Variance Accounts

a) **Error in Accounts 1588 and 1589’s 2020 Final-Disposed Balance** – the Decision approves a recovery of \$132,865 from its current customers over a one-year period. This amount does not include recovery of interest. The IRM Rate Generator Model has been updated with the amount of \$132,865 in Account 1589 on Tab 3. Continuity Schedule. The \$132,865 was allocated within the IRM Rate Generator Model as shown below in Table 1.

- b) **Accounts 1588 and 1589's 2022 Disposed Balances** – the Decision denies Orangeville Hydro's request to adjust the 2021 and 2022 balances of Accounts 1588 and 1589, as they were deemed final disposed in its 2024 Cost of Service Rate Application. The OEB determined that it follows that there is no need for an external review of the 2021 and 2022 balances. These Accounts 1588 and 1589 balances have been removed from Tab 3. Continuity Schedule of the IRM Rate Generator Model.
- c) **Accounts 1588 and 1589 Balances for December 31, 2023 and December 31, 2024** – the Decision denies Orangeville Hydro's request for interim disposition of its Accounts 1588 and 1589 balances for 2023 and 2024. The Decision requires Orangeville Hydro to conduct an external review of its balances for 2023 to 2025. Orangeville Hydro is to file the results of the review in its next rates application, and bring the accounts forward for disposition at that time. The Accounts 1588 and 1589 balances have been removed from Tab 3. Continuity Schedule of the IRM Rate Generator Model, other than the amount noted in part a) of this Draft Rate Order.
- d) **Disposition of Other Group 1 Accounts** – the Decision denies Orangeville Hydro's request for interim disposition of its December 31, 2024 Group 1 DVA balances, excluding Accounts 1588 and 1589, as it is not material enough to generate a rate rider. The Group 1 DVA balances have been removed from Tab 3. Continuity Schedule of the IRM Rate Generator Model and will be brought forward for disposition at Orangeville Hydro's next rate application.
- 2. Electric Vehicle Charging Rate** – Orangeville Hydro confirms that, as of May 1, 2026, it will provide eligible customers with the option to elect to be charged Retail Transmission Service Rates on the basis of the Electric Vehicle Charging Rate.
- 3. Final Bill Impacts** – Final bill impacts that reflect the Draft Rate Order are provided in Table 4 below. Details are included in the corresponding IRM models attached to this Draft Rate Order.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification refers to the supply of electrical energy to residential customers residing in detached, semi detached, townhouse (freehold or condominium) dwelling units duplexes or triplexes. Basic connection is defined as 100 amp 120/240 volt overhead service. Class B consumers are defined in accordance with O. Reg. 429/04. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, or as specified herein.

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

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If included in the following listing of monthly rates and charges, the rate rider for the disposition of WMS - Sub-account CBR Class B is not applicable to wholesale market participants (WMP), customers that transitioned between Class A and Class B during the variance account accumulation period, or to customers that were in Class A for the entire period. Customers who transitioned are to be charged or refunded their share of the variance disposed through customer specific billing adjustments. This rate rider is to be consistently applied for the entire period to the sunset date of the rate rider. In addition, this rate rider is applicable to all new Class B customers.

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TARIFF OF RATES AND CHARGES

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If included in the following listing of monthly rates and charges, the rate rider for the disposition of Global Adjustment is only applicable to non-RPP Class B customers. It is not applicable to Wholesale Market Participant (WMP), customers that transitioned between Class A and Class B during the variance account accumulation period, or to customers that were in Class A for the entire period.
