Six Nations of the Grand River

**Answers to Interrogatories from
Ontario Energy Board Staff**

Interrogatory: OEB STAFF-1

Reference: Affidavit of Peter Graham, sworn March 18, 2026

Preamble:

Six Nations stated that the affidavit provides important evidence regarding consultation meetings between Enbridge Gas and Six Nations.

The evidence of Six Nations outlines the consultation process related to the Port Colborne application starting with first notification by Enbridge Gas on April 22, 2025, and continuing until November 25, 2025.

The evidence describes the issues and concerns raised by Six Nations and Enbridge Gas' activities in response to Six Nations' concerns. The concerns of Six Nations include a lack of baseline data in Enbridge Gas' route selection methodology, cumulative impacts of the Port Colborne Project, and the adequacy of the Environmental Report. Six Nations expressed that Enbridge Gas "...failed to take seriously..."¹ their concerns. Six Nations submitted that Enbridge Gas filed the application with the OEB while the consultation was "...only just beginning..."² Six Nations' evidence included information on June 10, 2025, October 9, 2025, and November 25, 2025, consultation meetings.

Question (1):

- (1) Please describe the dates, format, scope and nature of consultation between Enbridge Gas and Six Nations following the meeting on November 25, 2025.

Response to Question (1):

Following the meeting on November 25, 2025, the following has occurred:

- (a) On December 4, 2025, Enbridge provided copies of the notes taken at the November 25, 2025 meeting, and advised SNGR that it would be reaching out to “schedule meetings to continue the conversation and take action on the items discussed” at this meeting.³ SNGR notes that this email came after Enbridge had already filed its Application, on November 19, 2025.
- (b) A meeting took place on April 21, 2026. No significant progress was made. For example, at the June 2025 meeting, Enbridge had told SNGR that it would review Metrolinx’s vegetation guide to determine where Enbridge’s policies in this area could be improved. SNGR followed up on this at the April 21, 2026 meeting, and Enbridge said it had not yet reviewed the guide. Enbridge also refused to discuss financial accommodation in good faith, taking the position that none is owed and that it opposes any accommodation.

Question (2):

- (2) Please discuss if issues and concerns raised by Six Nations were addressed or resolved in consultation with Enbridge Gas after November 25, 2025.

Response to Question (2)

SNGR’s concerns have not been addressed or resolved with Enbridge following the November 25, 2025 meeting. The concerns SNGR has had from the outset of this Project, which are described in the Affidavit of Peter Graham and in SNGR’s intervenor submissions, remain unaddressed.
