**Re: Enbridge Gas Inc.  
Application for 2024 Rates – Phase 3  
Board File No.: EB-2025-0064**

We are counsel to Minogi Corp. (“**Minogi**”) and Three Fires Group Inc. (“**TFG**”), as joint-intervenors, in the above-noted proceeding (the “**Proceeding**”). Pursuant to Procedural Order No. 6 dated April 28, 2026, please find attached the cost claims of Minogi and TFG in the Proceeding.

**Submissions.** Minogi and TFG respectfully request an award of 100% of their eligible costs, given their strategic and principled participation in the Proceeding, reflecting the unique interests and rights of Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation (“**MSIFN**”) and Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation (“**CKSPFN**”), two distinct First Nations, and their respective members. Minogi and TFG submit that this request is supported by the following considerations:

- (i) Minogi and TFG participated effectively in the Proceeding, taking a narrow, principled, and coordinated approach to matters related to the rights and concerns of MSIFN and CKSPFN and assisted in contributing to the applicant’s, other intervenors’, and the Board’s better understanding of such concerns and matters;
- (ii) Minogi and TFG ensured that their participation in the Proceeding was focused on material issues and consistent with the scope of their intervention, as set out in their respective Notices of Intervention;
- (iii) Minogi and TFG coordinated significantly with each other throughout the Proceeding in a responsible and efficient way to advance each of their interests and worked together to provide joint interrogatories, submissions, and testing of evidence, consistent with Minogi and TFG’s letter to the Board dated May 28, 2024, and the Board’s more general direction for broader coordination between intervenors;
- (iv) Minogi and TFG also collaborated with the other Indigenous intervenors, and members of the Indigenous Working Group, to coordinate interrogatories, pursue settlement on issues

of unique interests to the Indigenous intervenors, and prepare submissions in collaboration with the other Indigenous intervenors in order to limit overlap and efficiently advance issues of mutual interest, all of which is consistent with the Board's direction for broader coordination between intervenors; and

- (v) Minogi and TFG jointly participated responsibly and engaged with other intervenors and Board Staff to avoid overlap, maximize efficiency, and ensure that its participation was not unduly repetitive and was focused on relevant and material issues to MSIFN and CKPFN.

We trust that this approach has maximized the efficient use of resources and the right of otherwise unrepresented and important Indigenous energy stakeholders to be heard in a manner that is consistent with their constitutionally protected rights and the Board's mandate and statutory objectives.

Minogi and TFG respectfully requests a full award of eligible costs.
