Re: Phase II of the Distribution Customer Connections Review and Streamlining Transmission Connections Review — Toronto Hydro-Electric System Limited request to participate on Customer Connections Advisory Group

On June 9th, 2026, the OEB launched Phase II of its Distribution Customer Connections Review (“DCC Review”) and Streamlining Transmission Connections Review initiatives, intended to implement proposals set out in the OEB’s December 2025 Report to the Minister of Energy and Mines. The Report summarized various findings and recommendations from the OEB’s earlier Phase I of the DCC Review, intended primarily to streamline customer connection processes. As part of Phase II of the DCC Review, the OEB is establishing both an advisory group and a new working group to support the implementation of the various Phase I proposals and has invited stakeholders to notify the OEB of their interest to participate.

Toronto Hydro was an active member on the OEB’s Phase I DCC Review Working Group, and by way of this letter, nominates Mr. Aaron Silver, Manager, Climate Action Transportation Initiatives, as its representative to the OEB’s Phase II advisory and working groups. Mr. Silver has extensive operational experience and expertise in Toronto Hydro’s customer connections processes, including leading customer connection experience initiatives, as well as leading the operationalization of the recently implemented Electric Vehicle Charging Connections Procedures. In his current role, Mr. Silver is directly responsible for overseeing electric vehicle projects, including EV customer connections and associated procedures. Given his roles and experience, Toronto Hydro expects that Mr. Silver is particularly well positioned from the perspective of improving the customer connection experience and will be able to assist the OEB with a broad range of issues that may arise during the course of this initiative. 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Toronto Hydro is one of Ontario's largest electricity distribution companies, with a unique distribution grid situated in a dense urban environment, supplied by many interconnections with the transmission network, and serving over 790,000 customers and delivering approximately 18 per cent of the electricity consumed in Ontario. Serving one of the fastest growing and largest cities in North America, Toronto Hydro receives a high volume of requests for connections and upgrades for residential and commercial developments each year: for the 2025-2029 period, over 700,000 new residential units are forecasted, which are expected to include a combination of new condominium towers, conversions of housing from low density to medium density, as well as neighbourhood redevelopments (e.g. Downsview, Golden Mile, Port Lands, Villiers Island). Toronto Hydro was an active working group member as part of the OEB's Phase I DCC Review and continues to have a very strong interest in participating on the OEB's new Advisory Group as part of Phase II.

Toronto Hydro appreciates the OEB's consideration of its nomination and looks forward to working with stakeholders in reviewing, evaluating, and streamlining distribution connections standards.
