EB-2025-0295 Enbridge Gas Inc. ("Enbridge") 2027-2030 Demand Side Management (DSM) Plan Application - Building Owners and Managers Association Toronto Request to Advance the Procedural Meeting Date

The Building Owners and Managers Association Toronto ("BOMA Toronto") writes with respect to Procedural Order No. 5, issued July 7, 2026, which scheduled a procedural meeting for August 11, 2026, to discuss process-related issues and subsequent procedural steps. BOMA Toronto respectfully requests that the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) consider advancing the procedural meeting to an earlier date in light of the direct scheduling conflict described below and the benefit of providing parties with an earlier opportunity to discuss and establish an appropriate solution.

Background

In Procedural Order No. 5, the OEB postponed the technical conference in this proceeding, previously scheduled for July 8–10, 2026, to July 28–30, 2026, and confirmed the procedural meeting for August 11, 2026.

BOMA Toronto is also an active intervenor, represented by the undersigned, in EB-2025-0312 (Ellexicon Energy Inc.'s application for electricity distribution rates and other charges beginning January 1, 2027). In Procedural Order No. 3, issued in that proceeding on July 2, 2026, the OEB confirmed a settlement conference for July 27–31, 2026.

Scheduling Conflict

As a result, the technical conference in this proceeding and the settlement conference in EB-2025-0312 overlap on July 28, 29, and 30, 2026. The undersigned is the sole representative for BOMA Toronto in both proceedings and is therefore unable to attend both events while they are scheduled to take place at the same time. Both proceedings are very important to BOMA Toronto as its members will be directly affected by the outcomes of these proceedings.

BOMA Toronto understands that a number of intervenors active in this proceeding are also intervenors of record in EB-2025-0312 and may face similar constraints, depending on the availability of their respective representatives.

Advancing the Procedural Meeting

The procedural meeting scheduled for August 11, 2026, is intended to provide an opportunity for parties and the Panel to discuss process-related issues and subsequent procedural steps. BOMA Toronto believes that this procedural meeting is the appropriate forum to explore workable solutions that could address the scheduling conflict.

Accordingly, BOMA Toronto submits that advancing this meeting to an earlier date, preferably at least one to two weeks before July 28, 2026, would allow parties to raise the scheduling conflict directly with the Panel and to explore, together with Enbridge and other participants, whether an adjustment to the technical conference dates or other accommodations could resolve the conflict.

BOMA Toronto recognizes that Procedural Order No. 5 already reflects considerable effort by the OEB to balance competing scheduling constraints in this proceeding. BOMA Toronto does not intend, by this request, to cause any substantive delay in the advancement of this proceeding. Rather, BOMA Toronto's request is limited to advancing the date of the procedural meeting so that the scheduling conflict may be addressed through an appropriate solution and with sufficient lead time for all parties.
