To Whom It May Concern,

The City of Ottawa has reviewed the proposed Orléans Area Reinforcement Project and appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the application.

The City recognizes the importance of investing in electrical infrastructure to support future growth and improve system reliability. As the project proceeds through detailed planning and implementation, the City requests that Hydro One continue to coordinate closely with municipal staff to minimize impacts to planned municipal infrastructure projects and to identify opportunities for coordinated construction where practical.

The Infrastructure and Water Services Department has identified the following current and planned capital projects that are located within, or in close proximity to, the proposed transmission corridor:

- CP1143 – Culvert East Package 4 (Dan Brazeau). – Design phase, construction in 2027. Conflict location: Russell Road at Hydro Rd culvert location.
- CP1096 – Renaud Rd Realignment (Joe Mojsej) – Planning phase, construction 2028-2030 pending budget confirmation. Conflict location: Along future realigned Renaud Rd up to Brian Coburn Blvd./Navan Rd. Project team is aware and will be reaching out to Hydro One to review projects and possible constraints.
- CP963 – Miscellaneous Drainage improvements (Bin Wang) – Design phase, construction in late 2026 – early 2028. Conflict location: Renaud Rd at Joshua St (not a direct conflict)

In addition to these projects, the City anticipates future roadway resurfacing work at both ends of the proposed corridor that may also benefit from ongoing coordination as project schedules are finalized.

The City requests that Hydro One continue to engage with the appropriate municipal project teams throughout detailed design and construction to:

Coordinate schedules where feasible to minimize impacts to residents and the travelling public.

Identify opportunities to reduce conflicts between projects.

Coordinate traffic management, utility relocations, and construction staging where appropriate.

Share design information as it becomes available to facilitate timely municipal planning and approvals.

The City looks forward to continuing to work collaboratively with Hydro One to successfully deliver both the Orléans Area Reinforcement Project and the City's planned infrastructure investments.
