Re: **EB-2025-0183 – Electricity Storage Licence-Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1**

On July 17, 2025, the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) issued a [Decision and Order](#) approving Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP's application for an electricity storage licence. The decision noted that the grant of the electricity storage licence shall not take effect until Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP advises the OEB that the facility described in its application has been constructed and is ready to commence commercial operation.

In a [letter](#) dated June 5, 2026, Alectra Energy Services Inc. (Alectra) the parent of Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP, informed the OEB that construction of its facility is scheduled to be completed, and is anticipated to begin commercial operation in mid-July 2026.

On July 10, 2026, OEB staff informed Alectra that under the licensing provisions of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, including sections 57, 60 and 74, only a "person" may hold an OEB licence. As a limited partnership is not a legal person, the OEB's preferred approach is to issue licences in the name of a general partner on behalf of the limited partnership (for example, "Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 GP Inc. on behalf of Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP").

To ensure that the licence is issued to an entity that meets the statutory definition of a "person," OEB staff requested that Alectra submit a letter requesting an amendment to the licence for the Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP facility.

In a letter dated July 27, 2026, Alectra requested that the OEB issue the licence to Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 GP Inc. on behalf of Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP. The letter stated that the general partnership does not engage in any business activities apart from the operation of the energy storage facility and there is no need to update or amend the financial statements which were supplied as part of the original application. The letter also confirmed that there was no change to the information on Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP's list of directors, affiliates and primary contact information. The information that Alectra provided makes clear that all other information in Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP's application for an electricity storage licence filed on May 29, 2025 will remain unchanged for the amended licensee.

The OEB accepts Alectra's proposal to identify Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 GP Inc. on behalf of Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP as the licensee and notes that the technical capability and financial information pertaining to Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 GP Inc. remain substantially the same as those of its limited partner. Accordingly, the OEB finds that it is in the public interest to issue an electricity storage licence to Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 GP Inc. on behalf of Vaughan 3 Energy Storage 1 LP.
