

Ontario Energy Board Land Acknowledgement

By acknowledging the land on which we operate, we recognize the unique relationship each of us has with the land and the Indigenous peoples who have been living and working here for thousands of years. With these words, we renew our commitment to learning and reconciliation.

The Ontario Energy Board acknowledges that our headquarters in what is now called Toronto is located on land covered by Treaty 13 (Toronto Purchase), and is the territory of the Anishinaabeg Nation, Haudenosaunee Nation, and Wendat Nation. The long and rich history of this land is marked by many other treaties and nation-to-nation agreements, including the Dish with One Spoon and Two-Row Wampum belt covenants.

Traditionally, this land was a meeting place for many Nations from across Turtle Island and is now home to many First Nations, Métis people, and Inuit. We are grateful for the opportunity to live, work, and learn on this land, and we acknowledge our shared responsibility to all our relations as we work toward a sustainable, equitable energy sector across Ontario.
