Introduction

These are the submissions of Energy Probe Research Foundation ("Energy Probe") in respect of the Application of Union Gas Limited ("Union") for rates in the second year of a 5 year incentive rate making mechanism and in response to Union's Argument in Chief, filed December 19, 2008.

Energy Probe has reviewed the Applicant's pre-filed evidence, interrogatory responses and Argument in Chief. In addition, Energy Probe has reviewed the submissions of The City of Kitchener ("Kitchener"), filed December 23, 2008, and the submissions of the London Property Management Association ("LPMA"), filed December 29, 2008.

2009 Inflation Factor and Productivity Factor

Energy Probe accepts both the calculation of the Inflation Factor and the Productivity Factor as applied for by the Applicant in this proceeding.

Z Factor Adjustments

Energy Probe supports the submissions of LPMA in respect of the treatment of tax changes by the Applicant in particular and in respect of Union's proposed 2009 rates in general.

Further, Energy Probe supports the conclusions by both Kitchener and LPMA that the evidence of Union is not sufficient to entitle it to a Z Factor Adjustment in any year of the incentive rate mechanism in respect of the cost consequences of adopting International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS").

Process

Counsel for the Canadian Manufacturers & Exporters ("CME"), Mr. Peter

Thompson, submitted a letter on December 16, 2008 in EB-2008-0219, the Enbridge

Gas Distribution ("Enbridge") 2009 Rates proceeding, also in the second year of a 5

year incentive rate making mechanism. Energy Probe supports the CME's position

in that proceeding and submits that the same face-to-face process outlined by Mr.

Thompson would be an improvement in future Union incentive rate making

mechanism proceedings.

Costs

Energy Probe submits that it participated responsibly in this proceeding. Energy

Probe requests the Board award 100% of its reasonably incurred costs.
